

CHILI TOWN BOARD
November 18, 2015

A meeting of the Chili Town Board was held on November 18, 2015 at the Chili Town Hall, 3333 Chili Avenue, Rochester, New York 14624 at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Supervisor David Dunning.

PRESENT: Councilman Brown, Councilwoman DiFlorio; Councilman Slattery, Councilwoman Sperr and Supervisor David Dunning.

ALSO PRESENT: Dawn Forte, Supervisor's Secretary; Sandra Hewlett, Stenographer; Virginia Ignatowski, Town Clerk; Daniel Knapp, Director of Finance; Councilman Slattery, Deputy Town Supervisor; Richard Stowe, Counsel for the Town; Eric Vail, Insurance Counselor. David Lindsay, Commissioner of Public Works/Highway Superintendent and Building Department Representative was excused.

The invocation was given by Virginia Ignatowski.

The Pledge of Allegiance was cited. The fire safety exits were identified for those present.

PRESENTATIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS:

1. Presentation to Mary White, School Traffic Guard.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Unfortunately, Mr. Lindsay couldn't join us today. He is down in some exotic place playing disk golf or disk frisbee. Looks like he was enjoying himself out under the sun and palm trees by the ocean.

Mary White, would you please join us? This is just a small token of our appreciation, Mary (White), for the 23 years that you have served as our crossing guard, making sure our kids have been safe getting across the street. I see you're here with some of the other folks now who -- who have helped us, and I know it's a thankless job at times. You get out there in the snow, the rain. It doesn't matter what the condition you guys have been out there, but we want to thank you for your 23 years of service and on behalf of the Town Board and Town of Chili, I just to present you with a little plaque and token of appropriation. And I will miss you at the breakfast every year.

MARY WHITE: I still might come.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: That's fine. You can. Any time you want.

MARY WHITE: Good seeing you.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Mary (White), thank you again. We appreciate it.

PUBLIC HEARING

A Public Hearing was held by the Chili Town Board on November 18, 2015 at the Chili Town Hall, 3333 Chili Avenue, Rochester, New York 14624 at 7:05 p.m. to discuss the 2015 Town of Chili bicycle and pedestrian master plan.

Attendance as previously noted in the 11/18/15 Chili Town Board meeting minutes.

COMMENTS OR QUESTIONS FROM THE AUDIENCE: None.

The Public Hearing was closed at 7:05 p.m.

At this point, a Public Forum was conducted to allow public speakers to address the Town Board. The following speaker addressed the Town Board on various subjects: Christopher McCullough. The Public Forum concluded at 7:08 p.m.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: I will address that. We have had a couple of conversations about this particular property, with its previous tenant and current tenant. We do have Code Enforcement looking at any violations that may be of Town Code. Beyond violations of Town Code, right at this point we have very little. We have been in contact with the Monroe County Sheriff's Office and they have focused on a special attention list, so to speak, if you will, so we are doing as much as we can right now. We have, as you know -- and I will share some of it so that the audience understands, we have passed property maintenance legislation that deals quite a bit with -- while not specific to zombie homes, as they have been qualified, it does deal with property maintenance and should the property maintenance go beyond the limits of the code,

certainly Code Enforcement would be at that property and address that appropriately.

We have made efforts to find the actual landlord whose address is actually listed as that same address. So we're really not sure where he is either. But we have made attempts to try to find the property owner and we'll continue to make those attempts to find the property owner to let them know what is going on and what -- the concerns the Town of Chili has. This is not being ignored, and I understood this was -- this was more to make sure this got on the public record and certainly all of you understood what was going on at this point in time, just so you know.

COUNCILWOMAN DIFLORIO: Is the house in foreclosure?

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: I can't -- I have not looked it up on our Town's website, so I would have to take the word here and understand that --

COUNCILWOMAN DIFLORIO: Because I thought we required that the banks file something --

MR. MCCULLOUGH: There was a short sale in January.

COUNCILWOMAN DIFLORIO: -- as part of our property maintenance code.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: I would to go back to -- exactly what we put in the code, Tracy (DiFlorio), I don't exactly remember what that was, but to go back and look at that -- but we'll exercise all means that the Town of Chili has to its disposal to rectify the situation to the best of our ability.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: We know this is just not over on Archer. It's four houses away from me. For six years, this one has been vacant that -- since I have been there and there is another one the guy just got up and moved to Tennessee a year ago and left his house. So.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Well, we have the property now on Names Road that we're looking at possibly doing demo, the people just up and left and left everything.

COUNCILWOMAN SPERR: Couple on Marshal. They're all over.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: If you recall, we had some people in here talking about 31 Saddleback, it was a big problem. The bank was actually maintaining the property. Eventually that's been sold. The neighbors called me and said thank you very much. The property was sold at auction and the current owner is in there fixing the place up nice and the neighbors are all very happy. That was 13 years in foreclosure. So there are some success stories, although they are painful and take a little bit of time.

I will move along unless anybody else has anything.

MATTERS OF THE SUPERVISOR:

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: As I had mentioned, the -- the parade of lights and the tree lighting ceremony, December 4th, 5 p.m. -- 6 p.m.

COUNCILWOMAN DIFLORIO: I think the line-up is around 5:00, 5:30.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: 5:30, hopefully we can get together and decide what we'll do. I hope the community as a whole decides they would like to participate. I believe Rick (Vail) said he would put together a nice little float and maybe get that little GEICO guy to do something for us.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: You will not have Dan (Knapp) dress up -- is he? Yukon Cornelius.

COUNCILWOMAN DIFLORIO: Anybody is able to participate, so if any of the audience members would like to participate and be in the parade.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Nonetheless, I want to share a correspondence that I did receive, and this was back after the last Town Board meeting, so I didn't have a chance to share it with the Town Board then. This was actually passed on to Dawn (Forte) from the Fire Department. I will read it verbatim if you don't mind.

"This past weekend five firefighters from Chili along with over 100 from throughout our area attended the American Lung Association's stair climb in support of lung disease. The climb is 20 stories, 400 plus stairs to the top of the Legacy Tower, which is the old Bausch & Lomb building downtown. With our full firefighter turn-out gear and breathing on an air pack, this is the third year the Chili Fire Department has fund-raised and competed. The first year Company 4's team was the fastest overall combined time. This year, firefighter Dan Newman was the fastest individual firefighter with just over three minutes. The team raised over \$1,000."

Three minutes, 20 stories, 400 plus stairs.

RICHARD STOWE: Carrying stuff.

COUNCILWOMAN DIFLORIO: With all of the gear.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: I just wanted to acknowledge that. That is really quite the accomplishment. That is amazing stuff.

COUNCILWOMAN SPERR: Pretty cool.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Fortunately, we don't have anything with 20 stories or 400 stairs, but I can't imagine how quickly they would get up to a couple story building.

Congratulations, Dan (Newman), and the Chili Fire Department for their accomplishment. Very nice.

COUNCILWOMAN SPERR: Thanks, David.
