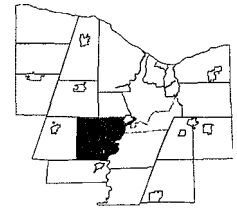

Minutes of the 3/6/08 Meeting

OLD BUSINESS 12/5/02

Item # 1 Dan Moffit from the Chestnut Home Owner Association addressed the committee to request that the intersection of Hunt Hollow and Sothery Place be converted into a 4-way stop. Committee agreed to reinstall "cross traffic does not stop" signs. **The signs will be put up on 2/3/08.**

OLD BUSINESS 7/6/06

Item # 4 Traffic is backing up on Rt. 259 past Rt. 490 exit from Chili Ave., reported by committee members the problem continues, mini gridlocks. What is the schedule for the permanent fix to the problem? The committee would like to see a "right turn lane only". M. Sperr has learned that a "right turn lane" is not in the current plan. The committee is concerned that current design will not fix current problems and may make them worse. **State to widen road for 2 lanes for southbound traffic, one lane for turns (no signal upgrade), M. Sperr will get together with Senator Alesi and ask for additional state funding for improvements.**

OLD BUSINESS 10/4/07

Item # 2 Barb Denigris of 254 Archer Rd representing a group of residents living on Archer Rd, requested a speed monitor which would show drivers how fast they are going. The residents are concerned about safety as current speeds are in excess of the 30mph. **Committee will continue to monitor, and the towns temporary signs will be set up in the spring. Compliant come in from 248 Archer also.**

- Item # 3 Beverly Iachetta of 9 Red Bud Rd requested a speed bump due to speeding on the curve. **Committee will continue to monitor the speed.**

OLD BUSINESS 11/1/07

- Item # 3 Committee reviewed plans for new Target store next to Wegmans.
- a- no parking up against building or along the west side of building.
 - b-** complete road behind complex for emergency equipment to drive around complex.
 - c- do not attach the new store to the existing building, keeping a road between the two buildings for emergency equipment to gain access to rear of complex.
 - d- no truck traffic to enter complex off of Chili Ave.

Guest Christopher Wood, Stephen Aldrich and Jerry Goldman presented upgraded plans for the exit at Wegmans across from K-Mart and addressed all concerns voiced by the committee.

Committee recommends additional improvements to the road from Chili Ave. south to Wegmans.

- 1 – continue side walk from Chili Ave down to the buildings.
- 2 – branch sidewalk east to the entrance for the doctors offices, and into the doctors offices.
- 3 – no defined crosswalks east to west on the paved road, only north to south.
- 4 – Paul entrance, move median back 6 to 8 feet more to allow tractor trailers to make the right turn without having to swing wide to the left.

OLD BUSINESS 12/6/07

- Item # 2 **Mr. Cheng-Ning Jong** of 92 Parkway Dr. has again requested help with the problem of cars not negotiating the curve in front of his house. The last car ended up on its side resting up against Mr. Jong's house. **J. Carr has moved the "curve sign". The committee has suggested the following: installing a "stop sign at the intersection of Parkway Dr. and Gilead Hill Rd., installing hedges on the front lawn to stop vehicles, and inverted rumble strips.**
- Item # 3 Churchville Chili School bus was hit by a car passing on the right shoulder at the intersection of Rt. 259 and Chili Ave. The intersection continues to be a hazard.

OLD BUSINESS 1/3/08

- Item # 2 Chili Ave west just past Carpenter's garage, road is breaking up. Dave Lindsey to correct.
- Item # 3 Making a right turn from Chili Coldwater Rd. onto Rt. 490 E., many cars are not making the turn and sliding off into the ditch. Dave Lindsey to follow up With Mr. Goehring at NYSDOT.
- Item # 4 Intersection of Chili Ave. and Chestnut Ridge extension is extremely difficult to pull out from Chestnut Ridge onto Chili Ave.

OLD BUSINESS 2/7/08

- Item# 1 Signal light at the intersection of Chili Coldwater Rd. and Chestnut Ridge needs to be re-timed.
- Item # 2 Committee reviewed plans for a 66 room motel by Microtell behind Valvoline and the Bank of Castile on Chili Ave. The committee had some concerns:
 - a – size of road width and radius of curve
 - b – one way traffic around building
 - c – fire access on plan with front parking **only**
- Item # 3 Railroad tracks on Paul Rd. near Beahan Rd. are very rough.
- Item # 4 Request for lighting on Paul Rd. near Lifetime Assistance Committee to review.

NEW BUSINESS 3/6/08

- Item # 1 Betsy Davis Brugg and Stephen Aldrich presented modification to the plans for the Target Store to built next to Wegmans. The modifications are to both entrances. Improve pedestrian traffic from Chili Ave. into the complex and improve the turn radius at Paul Rd. for the tractor trailers. Committee approved of the modification.
- Item # 2 Request for "Stop Signs" at the intersection of Crossbow Dr. and Labrea Dr. **Committee to investigate.**
