Glenna Osborne, 35 Clifton Rd. Churchville, NY 14428. (school house) The bell tower is missing.

Harmon House on Wheatland Center Rd. (There is a millstone in the middle of a cobblestone circle)

Of 11 original school houses only 3 are left:

- School #2 Nicole Sanza, 550 Paul Rd. Rochester, 14624 owned by Zackory Degen
 - School #5 originally housed at 695 Morgan Rd. It was moved eventually to 35 Clifton-- Glenna's Osborne's home.
 - School #10 Robert J. and Rosalind Valeria, 278 Morgan Rd. Scottsville, NY 14546
- The above schools are the only schools with residential owners.

Reception for Landmark Home owners and prospective applicants: We discussed updating current landmark homes with new pictures (Melissa will take the pictures). We can have a

reception during one of our monthly meetings with refreshments and displays including a computer slide show. We can present the advantages of having this distinction on a home. A speaker from Genesee Country Museum or other organization could be invited. Bonnie will compose a letter. We can include the current flyer and an application with it.

We have three brass plates in the preservation office which may be used when needed. Circa dates are 1835, 1838 and 1885.
