From the Supervisor

March comes in like a lion... to say the least. We experienced three major weather events in three weeks! I would like to share with you how the Town of Chili responded to these events to assure our residents stayed safe and had a warm place to go.

Around the first of March, high winds took down some trees and created some minor problems around town. We have seen this before, and was nothing we couldn't handle. However, on March 8 the winds came back with a vengeance. Winds in excess of 80 mph were measured at the Airport. Trees came down throughout the area, taking power lines with them. Poles snapped in half, leaving over 100 thousand area residents without power.

From the beginning of the storm, reports of trees blocking roads and power lines down were piling in. Our crews did an amazing job clearing roads of debris. In fact, by the time the winds began subsiding at 6pm over 90% of our roads were clear and safe. Our crews remained on stand-by throughout the night and continued cleanup the very next morning.

Mother Nature wasn't done yet. Temperatures were expected to drop into the teens and thousands were without power and heat. At the onset of the storm, over 2,000 Chili properties were without power. I attempted to get resources from the Red Cross to open an emergency shelter at our Senior Center. The Red Cross was unable to provide the support we needed. We kept the Chili Senior Center and Chili Public Library open anyway, so people could come in, get warm, and perhaps

charge their electronics'.

Next, over a foot of snow was forecast for our area. That's not a big deal for most of us, unless you are one of the few residents that found themselves still without power. Then, that foot of snow became 26" of snow.

Our Highway, DPW & Parks crews did an amazing job throughout all of these events. From tree and debris removal to the best snow removal anywhere, we are blessed to have such dedicated men and women working for the Town of Chili. The safety of our residents has and will always be a top priority. Town History



Chili Historical Preservation Board
with Roberts Wesleyan College President,
Dr. Deana Porterfield

Cox Hall 1893 *Submitted by Bonnie Moore*

Perched atop a rising knoll on the campus of Roberts Wesleyan College in North Chili, is a rather unique building. It is unlike any other structure on campus. Some have described it as resembling a Swiss Chalet. In fact, it is really an English Tudor style. Its long history speaks to an era of skilled workmanship.

Edward P. Cox, for whom this building was named, was a friend and benefactor of Benjamin Titus Roberts, the founder of the college. A successful businessman from Buffalo, Cox was called upon to assess the dire situation in 1890, when a disastrous fire destroyed the only existing building at that time. The burned out hulk claimed all the belongings of that four-story building because no firefighting apparatus was equal to the task. Since students were required to

bring coal from home in order to provide heat for their rooms, perhaps a rogue ember was the culprit. A crowd of townspeople had gathered to watch the spectacle unfold. Soon thereafter, Roberts addressed the onlookers, stating the immediate need was great for finding housing and classroom space. He was not disappointed, and though this was the first week in September, all students had found a home and a room for classes. The tragedy soon turned to plans for a new building. When Cox learned of the fire, he made a sizable donation which enabled the seminary to start anew. Cox Hall was completed in 1893.

A tan stucco exterior was crisscrossed with huge brown timbers. The foundation is typical of that time. Irregular field stone, some cobblestone and rubble stone encircle the structure. Some stones

are quite large, leaving the observer to wonder what man power was used. Sturdy it must have been, to have lasted this long, given ravages of weather and building stress.

At the front, original double doors followed by original stone steps greet students. A rounded turret at the left has long windows, providing light to a professor's office. The windows are large three-over-one, meaning three panes set on top of one pane, a feature commonly used by architects then.

The two stories and basement have all been renovated extensively, fairly recently. The auditorium is basically the same, but with enhanced theater lighting for the stage. Many Classrooms and practice areas still retain their original charm. However, all the hallways are brightly lighted and carpeting softens the endless trampling

of younger footsteps. The basement for many years was dark and dank, though it was used as a mail room, a book store and a snack bar. Today it is as brightly lighted as the floors above, with many practice rooms. Did we mention that this is the music building? The department office is on the first floor, a very modern space. One thing has hasn't changed one bit would be the two narrow staircases at each end of the inside. They still creak loudly and are steep, an echoing reminder of the past 123 years.

During the middle 1900s, the library was once located on the second floor. It would be filled with students searching for information and researching the next assignment. A charming story emerged among others. One evening when most of the seats were taken, one gal found a seat next to a guy. Both of them spied a quarter lying on the floor. No one seemed to claim it. Neither one wanted to lose an opportunity to use that quarter. She asked, "Do you want it?" He asked the same of her. To break the impasse, they both decided to spend that quarter the next day together. They have been married for 53 years. Told by Janet and Keith Moore. (Not a bad exchange for a little coin) Cox Hall endures as a living monument—a vision of Benjamin Roberts and Edward Cox.

On March 22 at 2 PM, in Cox Hall on the Roberts Wesleyan College campus, the Chili Historical Preservation Board will present a bronze plaque in honor of Cox Hall's special landmark status.

Tentative Assessment Roll – May 1, 2017



Each year the tentative assessment roll is completed and filed for public inspection on or before May 1st. This document contains property descriptions, ownership, valuations and any exemptions that have been granted as of March 1st, the taxable status date.

Ultimately it is the responsibility of the property owner to review and verify that their property inventory published on the tentative is accurate (May 1st) and report to the Assessor (in a timely manner) any errors for change or corrections.

Spotlight: Board of Assessment Review



If a property owner is dissatisfied with the assessment for their property, they may appeal to the Board of Assessment Review on Grievance Day, which is the fourth Tuesday in May each year. This year, the date is on Tuesday, May 23, 2017.

Meeting with the BAR is an opportunity for you, the property owner, to present to an impartial community board, information concerning the value of your property.

To schedule an appeal, a completed complaint package, to include form (RP-524) with supporting documentation, along with five copies of the complaint package, must be filed with the Assessor's office, no later than the day the BAR meets for Grievance. However, property owners are asked to submit their complaint package(s) to the assessor's

office at least three business days prior to Grievance Day.

Appointment scheduling will begin on May 1st for Grievance Day (May 23rd). Times are scheduled, upon receipt, in a "next available" basis. Each appointment will be a 10-minute period and walk-in's on Grievance Day will be given the next available appointment. Appointments cannot be taken after May 23rd.

RP-524 Complaint of Real Property Assessment forms and Publication 1114 Contesting your Assessment in New York State, are available in the assessor's office starting May 1st or they may be found and downloaded from the NYS DTF website:

Are you turning 65 in 2018?



Would you like to save more on your school taxes? Well...Happy Birthday! If you are already receiving a Basic STAR exemption and will be turning 65 in the calendar year (Jan 1- Dec 31) 2018 you may be eligible to receive additional savings on your school tax bill! Eligibility also requires that your income be less than \$86,000 (IRS Form 1040: adjusted gross, line 37, minus IRA distributions, line 15b).

To do this, you must apply for the Enhanced STAR exemption; submit form RP-425-E along with proof of age and your 2016 income information before taxable status date of MARCH 1, 2018 to the Assessor's Office.

Exemption Changes Ahead For RPTL Section 458-b

A Cold War veteran is defined as a person, male or female, who served on active duty in the United States armed forces between September 2, 1945 and December 26, 1991, and who was discharged or released under honorable conditions.

The duration of the basic exemption is 10 years, and commences with the first taxable status date occurring on or after the effective date of the local law allowing the exemption. For those owners who acquire eligible property after this date, the 10-year period will be measured from the assessment roll based on application and determined eligibility. If, before the expiration of the 10-year period the exempt property is sold or replaced with other residential real property, this exemption may be granted for the unexpired portion of the 10-year period. The duration of the disability exemption under RPTL Sec. 458-b is permanent.

Recent Legislative changes were made to RPTL Section 458-b allowing School Districts to grant exemption benefits (S.2210-b, A.3379-a, signed 8/19 Ch. 253).

Cold War Exemptions are set to begin EXPIRING.....so what does this mean?

Real Property Tax Law Section 458-b was enacted in 2007 and adopted by Monroe County. The Town of Chili chose not to adopt. As stated above, the exemption duration is 10 years. So, savings on the County portion were first applied for applicants on their 2008 Town Continued on Page 4...

& County tax bill (applied commencing on the 2007 assessment roll). Thus these exemptions will start to expire and will be removed for the 2018 assessment roll (impacts the 2019 T&C tax bill). Subsequent years will begin to be impacted,

applicants for 2009 will be removed in 2018, 2010 to be removed in 2019, etc.

Be advised, the assessor has no authority to extend or grant the exemption beyond the specified date in RPTL Sec. 458-b. It is recommended that

all property owners, who wish to see this duration extended, contact their State Legislators and Veterans representatives and begin dialogue to enact legislative change to RPTL Section 458-b.

Tax Collection

The 2017 Town and County Tax collection period is drawing to a close. We are still collecting taxes at the Chili Town Tax Office, 3333 Chili Avenue, Rochester, NY 14624, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, until May 31, 2017.

Payments made April 1 – 30 have 4.5% interest applied and 6% interest is applied to any payments made May 1 – 31. Taxes that are unpaid by April 30th will receive a second notice of taxes due from the County and will incur an additional fee of two dollars (\$2.00) which will be levied and added to the tax bill. Payments through May 31st are made to Virginia Ignatowski, Tax Receiver and are mailed to the above address.

After May 31, 2017 all unpaid taxes plus interest is payable to the Monroe County Treasury, 39 West Main Street, Rochester, NY 14614.

Solicitors

With the return of nicer weather, there likely will be an increase in activity by door to door salespeople of products or services. Anyone peddling/soliciting must first obtain a permit from the Clerk's office. (Fundrais-

ing is exempt from this law, i.e. - school fundraisers and scouts.) Ask to see the person's peddler's permit. If they do not have one, you should contact the sheriff's office as it is illegal for them to sell without one. Please also contact the Clerk's office at 889-6127. To assist the Clerk in enforcement, it is helpful if you are able to supply the name of the individual as well as the company they are selling for.

This law was put into place to protect residents from unscrupulous individuals. When a person applies for a peddler's permit at the Clerk's office, they pay a fee and must provide a background check on themselves. The Clerk researches them and the company to assess their credibility and business practices. Applications have been denied based upon red flags such as poor BBB ratings, Attorney General Filings, news articles on problems encountered in other communities, etc.

People have questioned if this law also applies to religious organizations going door-to-door or politicians campaigning, and the answer to both of those situations is no, it does not; they are not selling anything, so

they do not require a permit.

If you have a bad experience with a legitimately licensed solicitor, please let the Clerk's office know. If multiple complaints are received, their license may be revoked. In addition, a strong case for denying future applications can be made.

Permitted solicitors are listed on the Town Clerk's Peddler's Permit page on the town website; www.townofchili.org.

New York State Marriage Licenses

Where to Obtain:

A couple intending to marry in New York State must apply in person for a marriage license at any town or city clerk in the state.

The Chili Town Clerk's Office is located at 3333 Chili Ave. Licenses are issued between 9:30 A.M. and 4:30 P.M. No appointment is necessary.

It generally takes about 15 minutes to obtain your license. Both parties must be present. Blood tests are no longer required.

The application for a license must be signed by both parties in the presence of the town or city clerk. A representative cannot ap-

ply for the license on behalf of the couple. This applies even if the representative has been given the Power of Authority.

Documents Required to Obtain a License:

A person is required to establish proof of age and identity by submitting to the issuing clerk:

One of the following age-related documents:

- Birth Certificate
- Baptismal record
- Naturalization record
- Census record

And one of the following identity-related documents:

- Driver's license
- Passport
- Employment picture ID

Immigration record

If previously married, a certified copy of the Decree of Divorce or a Certificate of Dissolution of Marriage is required for each and every divorce, including judgements of divorce.

If a spouse is deceased, a copy of the death certificate is required.

The marriage license is valid 24 hours after it is issued and is only valid for sixty (60) days.

Cost to Obtain:

The fee for the license is \$40.00. We accept cash, check, Visa, Master Card and Discover.

The fee includes the issuance of a Certificate of Marriage which is sent to the applicant within 15 days after the license is returned by the officiate (person who

performs the ceremony).

Where to Obtain Copies of Marriage Records:

Marriage records are kept in the office that issued the original license. If you obtained your license at the Chili Town Clerk's Office and require a Certified Transcript of Marriage you may do so by remitting a notarized Marriage Research Form (available on the town website) or visiting the Town Clerks Office.

The fee for a Certified Transcript of Marriage Certificate is \$10.00.

Debris Pick-Up Program - Town Pick-up Schedule

In general, the Town picks up brush and tree limbs on the schedule below. However, during times of increased service demand such as spring pickup season or after a severe storm, there will be delays which will impact the pickup schedule. For the latest information on the status of the pickup schedule, please contact the dispatch line at (585) 889-2630, prompt #2.

First & Third Full Week- (Starting on a Monday) North & West Chili- north from Chili Avenue and west from Chili-Coldwater Road.

Second & Fourth Full Week- East from Chili-Coldwater Road and south from Chili Avenue.

- **Brush and tree limbs** must be cut and stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the road. Please stack brush, logs, and shrubs separately. Limbs should be left as long as possible. Logs must be cut as short as possible. All material, except log pieces, will be chipped. Material not chipped will be collected by another vehicle, possibly the next day. Chips are available for reuse at the Highway garage storage area and by delivery to the home upon request. Leaf mulch is also available for reuse.
- **Green waste**, vines, weeds, sticks, and shrubs shall be piled separately for packer pick-up. PLEASE DO NOT BAG. WE WILL NOT PICK UP BAGS AND WE DO NOT PICK UP GRASS CLIPPINGS. Backyard composting is suggested.
- **Metal items** and white goods, EXCLUDING dehumidifiers, air conditioners, refrigerators, and freezers (unless Freon has been removed & Red Tagged). Please call your private hauler for details regarding those items.
- **Rocks, concrete, brick, and dirt.** Must be piled separately and not in pieces larger than 12". PLEASE DO NOT BAG.
- **Junk cars.** By appointment, and proof of ownership is required.

*******PLEASE HAVE ALL DEBRIS READY FOR PICK-UP ON THE SUNDAY EVENING PRECEDING YOUR WEEK OF SERVICE.**

All inquiries should be directed to the Department of Public Works Office at 889-2630, Monday- Friday between 7:00a.m. and 3:30p.m. NOTE: May through September, hours are Monday-Thursday 6:00 a.m. to 3:30p.m., Friday 6:00a.m. -10:00 a.m.

- No Tires - must be off rims to be collected by your private hauler
- Do not place items in concrete gutters, ditches, or on top of storm drains
- Pile materials separately from items to be collected by your private hauler
- No contractor-generated tree debris
- **Unreasonably large amounts of debris shall not be placed at the curbside without prior approval of the DPW.** Please contact 889-6156 for help in this matter.
- No construction debris or building materials
- No furniture, TVs, fuel tanks
- Residents having items which are considered hazardous waste material should call Monroe County Hazardous Waste at 753-7600 for information on disposal.

Warm Weather Tips

With the summer months just around the corner, you will surely find yourself spending extra time outdoors with your dog. Along with the fun, there are some precautions that should be taken. Here are some tips on how to help your dog enjoy their summer.

- Provide plenty of water and shade for your dog while they are outside.
- Dogs need exercise even when it is hot, but extra care needs to be taken with older dogs, short nosed dogs, and those with thick coats. On very hot days, limit exercise

to early morning or evening hours. Keep in mind the asphalt gets very hot and can burn their paws.

- With more time being spent outside, make sure your dog is always wearing their collar and dog license should they find themselves separated from you.
- It is quite possible for your dog to suffer from heat exhaustion and heat stroke. These conditions are very serious and could be fatal. In hot weather, keep on the lookout for signs of heat stress, which could include heavy panting, glazed eyes, a rapid pulse, unsteadiness, vomiting or a deep red or purple tongue. If your dog becomes overheated, immediately lower their body temperature by moving them into the shade and applying cool (not cold) water over their body to gradually lower their core body temperature. Let them drink small amounts of

water or lick ice cubes. Most importantly, get them to a veterinarian immediately.

- Never leave your dog unattended in a parked car. On warm days, the temperature in your car can rise to dangerous levels in minutes, even with the windows slightly open and even when the temperature outside seems cool. If you see a dog in a parked car in the summer, alert the management of the store so they can page the owner of the vehicle. If the owner does not respond promptly, please call 911 and they will contact our office immediately.

Pet Friendly Fourth Of July tips

- It is safer to keep your pets at home during Fourth of July celebration. Keep your pets in the house, rather than in your yard. He will be a lot happier indoors, and not tempted to leap over a fence to find you.
- Dogs can be startled by the loud noise of fireworks. Once the festivities begin, keep your pet in a safe room where he can feel comfortable. If he is crate trained put him in his crate covered with a blanket to make him feel secure.
- Block outside sights and sounds by lowering the blinds and turning on the television. Play soothing music in the background to counteract the sounds of the "rockets' red glare.
- If your pet seems overly anxious, spend some time with your pet, speaking soothingly to help them to relax.
- Avoid scraps from the grill. While tempting to our pets, any sud-



den change to your pets' diet can cause stomach upset. In addition, some certain foods like onions, avocado, grapes and raisins can be toxic.

- Human products can be dangerous to animals. Avoid spraying your pet with insect repellent and only use special sunscreen that is intended for animal use. Keep your pets away from matches and lighter fluid. They can be extremely irritating to the stomach, lungs and central nervous system, if ingested.
- Should your dog get scared, escape and run away, contact your local Animal or Dog Control

Shelter.

Make sure you securely fix your dog's license tag to their collar. A name tag for Fido's collar is also extremely helpful in the safe return of your pet. You may even consider micro chipping your pet. Most shelters and Veterinarian's have micro chip scanners.

If for some reason you think your pet has ingested something they shouldn't have and are unable to contact your veterinarian, the Animal Emergency Service of Rochester, located at 825 white spruce boulevard, is ready to take your calls concerning any animal mishaps or questions you may have. Don't Be Lost When Your Dog Is

One of the scariest moments we may face as dog owners is when our furry friend gets lost. It is an emotional time and most people don't know where to begin. Here is a checklist to help reunite you and your dog:

- File a report with your local Town's Dog Control Office, as well as any neighboring towns.
- Call the surrounding local Animal Veterinarian Clinics
- Check with your neighbors or homes around the area where the dog was lost.
- Look inside sheds, garages, and storage spaces in case the dog is trapped inside (particularly in cold weather)
- Make fliers and post around your neighborhood and where they were lost (including a photo, and any unique characteristics)
- Post and monitor listings in the 'lost + found' and the 'pets' section on Craigslist or Rochester Dogs lost or found.

One of the best ways to quickly find and be reunited with your animal is to be prepared before hand:

- Microchip your dog and keep your registration information current.
- Keep license tags, collars and identification name tags on your dogs, they can be quickly identified and returned quicker with these things in place.
- Have good photographs of your animals, including distinguishing markings.



If You Find a Lost Dog

Animal lovers sometimes find themselves in the situation of finding a lost dog wandering the streets or in their own backyard. Follow these simple steps when you find a lost dog to reunite them with their owners:

- Assume no matter how the dog behaves or what it looks like, the dog is owned and loved by someone who wants the dog back. "Think lost not strayed."
- Check for identification and have the animal scanned for a microchip (most vet clinics will do this for free).
- Turn the dog in to the town's dog control or animal control shelter where the dog was found - this is their best way to reconnect with their owners.
- Call 911 they will call the town's Dog Control Officer and make arrangements for the dog to be picked up.
- On behalf of all lost dogs and the families who miss them, thank you to everyone who goes out of their way to help reunite loving families with their pets!

A one year rabies vaccine will be given unless prior proof of vaccination is shown. A three year rabies vaccination will be given if a previous or current rabies certificate is shown. A certificate is the only legal form of proof. For safety reasons, please keep all dogs on leashes

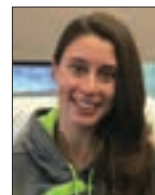

Park Spotlight

Union Station Park

The Town of Chili is proud to offer our lodge at Union Station Park which is available to rent for family and community events. Access to the park and lodge is off Union Street in North Chili at the end of Rock Island Road. This enclosed lodge offers accommodations for up to 80 people, indoor restroom facilities, kitchenette, and a full paved parking lot. Recreation facilities surrounding this lodge include playground equipment, a new sprayground, a nature trail, access to Black Creek, 2 athletic fields, a basketball court and a paved trail perfect for walking and biking.

Ballantyne Park

This is a two acre park located on Ballantyne Road, next to the Arc of Monroe County. Park amenities include a playing field and playground.

Chili Community Center

The Community Center is located at 4400 Buffalo Road in North Chili and is home to various recreational programs, special events and meetings. The building consists of meeting rooms, a program room, as well as a gymnasium. These facilities are available for public, non-profit groups to use. Along with the Center, the property has a baseball field, basketball court, and playground.

Chili Nature Trail

The Nature Trail is located off Chili Avenue, behind the Chili Heights Apartment complex. This 36-acre park is made up of various trails, an open field, scenic pond and two overlook areas.

Davis Park

Davis Park is a 52-acre park with two separate entrances. The park can be accessed from either Chestnut Ridge Road or Paul Road. Davis Park is home to six baseball fields, five soccer fields, two open air pavilions which are available for rent, restrooms, tennis courts, and two playground areas.

Hubbard Park

This seven acre park is located in North Chili on Union Street near Parkway Drive. Hubbard Park consists of a baseball field, tennis courts, a basketball court, and a playground.

Memorial Park

Located at 3235 Chili Avenue, this 11.6 acre park is home to many playing fields, a basketball court, tennis courts, and a playground. Memorial Park playing fields include six baseball fields, two of which have lights. Merante Field, which is a premier soccer/football field with lights, is also located at Memorial Park.

Yolanda Park

Yolanda Park, a 3.7 acre park, is located on Yolanda Drive and consists of a soccer field and playground equipment.

Widener Park

This 28-acre recreational area is located at 400 Chili-Scottsville Road. The property is home to an 18 hole disc-golf course, a picnic pavilion available for rent, beautiful landscapes and a trail perfect for exploring the park.

HOME DELIVERED MEALS:

The Monroe County Office for the Aging contracts with Visiting Nurse Service of Rochester and Monroe County, Inc. (585-787-8313) to assist with better health through nutrition. Often mealtime becomes a real challenge for individuals who are recuperating from an illness or who are too ill or frail to prepare a meal. Meals on Wheels is a service that provides the valuable nutrition needed. To be eligible for this service a person must be:

- at least 60 years of age;
- homebound;
- living alone or with someone who is unable to prepare nutritious meals and/or is absent during the day.

Visiting Nurse Service has numerous meal programs. The meals, which are funded by the Office for the Aging, have a suggested donation of \$3.00 per meal.

CHILI LIONS MEDICAL LOAN CLOSET:

Do you need to borrow some medical equipment? Feel free to contact the Loan Closet. They will do their best to help you out. To contact the Loan Closet for medical needs, or to make a donation, please call (585) 594-0839.



BOOKS TO PEOPLE PROGRAM:

Are you or someone you love unable to come to the library in person due to health reasons? If so, the Chili Public Library's "Books to People Program" is for you. This program is made possible by the Friends of Chili Public Library and is available to residents of Chili who are restricted from driving for health reasons.

"Books to People" provides free delivery of library materials to your home on a regular basis. A librarian will select materials for you based on the interests you indicate on your application. A volunteer member of the Friends will make deliveries to your home and pick up materials for return to the library. STAR PROGRAM:

STAR (Support to Aged Residents) is a unique program in Monroe County. It is the only program that offers individualized services to frail, elderly persons over 60 years of age, either by a donation-based or small fee for the service program. We need your help! Volunteers are needed to do simple things that many of our elderly neighbors cannot do for themselves. It just takes an hour or two of your time each month to brighten a life. Services may include transportation, grocery shopping, banking, or prescription pick-up. Occasional needs might be something as simple as friendly visiting, telephone reassurance, yard work, and chores.

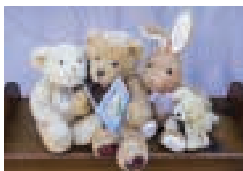

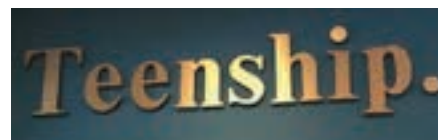

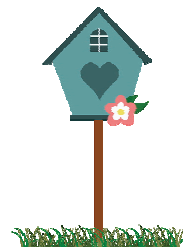

We would like to recognize James Lechner for achieving 50 years of service to the Chili Volunteer Fire Department.

Jim joined the fire department in 1/1/1967.

Throughout his 50 years of service Mr. Lechner has dedicated his time to his fellow firefighters and town residents by responding to hundreds of calls, performing countless hours of training and providing leadership and guidance in the management of this organization.

Mr. Lechner has risen through the ranks to the position of Battalion Chief in 1974 -1977, Vice President from 1978-1980, President in 1981 and again Vice President from 1988-2002.

Almost half of Jim's tenure in the department was spend in senior leadership positions, as a Battalion Chief, the President or Vice President.



He has also chaired our Buildings and Grounds Committee for many years ensuring our buildings were maintained in tip top shape. During this time significant renovations were made within department facilities, laying a solid foundation for future department growth and development.

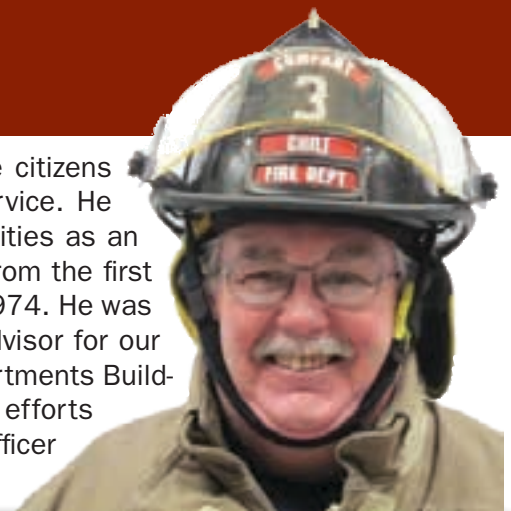
Jim continues to support the fire department in various ways.
