

Town of Chili Conservation Board – Approved Minutes December 5, 2016

Application of DiMarco Constructors, 1950 Brighton-Henrietta TL Road, Rochester, New York 14623, property owner: Cedars of Chili Housing Development; for preliminary site plan approval to erect a 640 sq. ft. addition to community building, 12' x 16' storage building, and 16' x 28' storage building (to replace existing 16' x 28' storage building) at property located at 94 Old Chili Scottsville Road in R.M. zone.

2. Application of American Packaging, c/o Lee Foerster, 100 APC Way, Columbus, Wisconsin 53925 for resubdivision approval of Lot ARB1 of the 100 Beaver Road Resubdivision into two lots at property located at 100 Beaver Road in L.I. zone.

No significant environmental impact. Not applicable at this time.

P.B. Response: Guest presenter. No products will be shipped or housed on sight. Only packaging material. There will be a complete presentation to the C.B. at the January meeting with landscape plans drawn up by a LLA. Proposal to get a variance to hold off on presently constructing 400 parking spaces until they are needed. Work shifts will eventually be 24/7 when fully staffed and operational. Once railroad spur is complete all materials will be delivered and shipped by rail. Until then, trucks will make all deliveries and shipments which could mean upwards of 60 trucks per day. Visitor – Concerned about truck and employee traffic. Visitor told employee traffic will be arriving before 7:00 AM.

3. Application of American Packaging, c/o Lee Foerster, 100 APC Way, Columbus, Wisconsin 53925 for preliminary site plan approval to erect a 400,000 sq. ft. light manufacturing warehouse at property located at 100 Beaver Road in L.I. zone.

Based on the plans submitted, there didn't appear to be any landscape buffering between the parking lot and Beaver Rd. There was no key or legend identifying the plantings or trees. The Conservation Board will need to see plans from a licensed landscape architect. We look forward to seeing the applicant's responses to the Conservation Board Checklist which will answer many of the questions raised by Conservation Board members.

Primary concern: What type of landscape drainage connects the two wetland drainage areas?
