## From the Supervisor

Hanging in my office are four pictures captioned "Determination", "Change", "Growth" & "Vision". I purchased these just prior to taking office in 2008. Just ten years later, these images continue to serve as a reminder of the principles necessary to lead a community and secure a solid foundation for our Town for years to come.

Over the last ten years we have prepared many plans and studies to guide the town in a direction that our residents desire. These studies have resulted in countless recommendations, many of which we have implemented or are working toward implementation. While committees worked on developing the Parks and Recreation Master Plan and the Chili Center Master Plan, a common theme emerged: Chili residents overwhelmingly desire for more open space, and parks and they should be made a priority.

On July 7th of this year we began working on this initiative. The Town purchased 48 acres of property on Archer Rd., a property some may know as the Zuber Farm. Eventually, we plan to connect this property to Memorial Park – developing athletic fields, play areas, and passive recreational opportunities along the way. The Town has considered preserving the barns and home on the property, but their rapid deterioration make that impractical. I expect that at some point in 2018 the demolition of the existing structures will take place, allowing us to proceed with the

vision of a new park. Fortunately, there are several State and Federal programs available to help fund any improvements to the property. I will strive to take advantage of each and every grant funding




opportunity for the benefit of our taxpayers.

### Chili in Art

eauty is in the eyes of the beholder. The aforementioned cliché has often qualified many peoples acceptance of neutral observation in ones own subject viewing. Expressions of form can be done through many different mediums or on many different grounds (backing). Early masters painted on plaster walls and ceilings. Large murals were done depicting the heavens, mythical phenomenon or story. Tapestries were woven depicting scenes of the past to be hung on the cold castle walls for warmth and art beauty.

Paper, canvas, wood, and masonite have been used to place pen and ink, oils, watercolors, and acrylics.

Organizations of art can be recognized in varied expressions. Individual expression is the most common. However, often groups of artist gather in clubs, quorums, and/or art shows, to show their "beauty of expression and techniques". Mediums used include: oil paints/canvas, photos, water colors, negatives, wood & carving and clay to mention but a few.

The Town of Chili is fortunate to have several such organizations, one of which I recognize is our own Chili Art Club. The first meeting of Community Artist was held September 6, 1960 in the basement of the old Gates Town Hall, with an active membership of 14 artists. One year later, September 5, 1961 Chili Recreation sponsored the Community Artist and on October 2, 1961 they voted to change their name to Chili Art Group. Today the membership includes 35 amateur and professional of varied expertise and ages ranging from 18 to 80. The annual spring show offers the work for viewing,

for sale and to foster civic pride in Chili past and present.

President, Joan Manley, acknowledges: "Our goal is to accommodate and encourage your interest in the arts by offering a meeting place featuring programs in a variety of artistic disciplines and affording you the occasion to become acquainted with people who may share your interests".

Art work is offered in many forms/expressions and mediums, for your visual treat, to our ancestral accomplishments. "Their foot-prints in many cases left an indelible mark on the future. Through the artist thoughts and actions they help to create lasting quintessential structures, helping future generations to retain natures-natural beauty".

The old structures lend an air of mystery, intrigue, beauty and sheer wonder of how they were created. Be it a vision of an old out-house, a stage coach stop, an iron bridge or the ole swimming hole in black creek, each were pertinent to the time they were constructed. Often we my not save the monument but we can at least preserve its memory.

Tools of the artist or accourrements of the trade, whether they be paint brushes, cameras or chisels & hammers, all are just as important as the stealth, patient and equipment of a big game hunter.

Chili also recognizes a vary talented group of artist known as Chili Woodcarvers, who meet every Wednesday, 9-12 at the senior center. Their sculptures in wood are phenomenal and often are on display.

adrenaline pumps, manpower and equipment roll into action! While this is the image most have of firefighters, there is another side to their efforts. Fire Prevention is a fundamental thread that winds its way through the fire department each year.

Educational programs provided by the Department consume many hours of our time during the year. Every Fall, during National Fire Protection

month in October, we present a Fire Safety circuriclum to nearly 2,000 children who attend preschool through 5th grade in the Chili Fire Department protection area. They meet with Firefighter Terry and her firefighter helpers to learn and review the basic techniques to insure their families are fire-safe. By spending time building relationships with these young friends their families become better prepared to respond in the event of a fire emergency.

In addition, our local Senior Citizen Community residences have become another educational stop on our educational track we've built. We now have several hundred new senior friends we visit with throughout the year to keep informed on the ways to be safe and well-prepared in case of an emergency.



- March 1st Taxable Status Date, exemption filing deadline; this date applies to new applications and any exemption required to do an annual renewal for continued eligibility. Also by law, property condition and ownership are determined as of this date.
- May 1st Tentative assessment roll is published; at this time the assessor may no longer make changes to assessed values; only changes that can be made are through the grievance process with the Board of Assessment Review.
- 4th Tuesday in May Board of Assessment Review (BAR) meets to hear complaint (griev-

ances) on assessments.

- July 1st Final assessment roll is published for the current year; properties are valued as of the previous July 1st (valuation date), as set by law.
- September 1st School tax bills are issued.
- October 1st to 31st Exemption renewal forms are mailed to property owners; renewal forms and their supporting documentation are due no later than taxable status date (March 1st).

Ultimately it is the responsibility of the property owner to review and verify that their property inventory published on the tentative roll (May 1st) is accurate and report to the Assessor (in a timely manner) of any errors for change or corrections or to file grievance with the BAR.

Taxable status date, Volume 8 Opinion of Counsel SBEA No. 5, RPTL §320 and §500; assessments must be based upon the condition and ownership of property as of taxable status date even if that date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday; however, in the event of such as the filing of an application for exemption, is extended until the next business day.

Both the tentative and final assessment rolls are published and placed on the Town webpage (required by law) and they are available in the assessor's office during business hours.

## Are you turning 65 in 2018?

Would you like to see if you could save more on your school taxes?



First things first...Happy Birthday! If you are already receiving a Basic STAR exemption and will be turning 65 in the calendar year 2018; that means your birthday occurs on a day between January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2018; then you may be eligible to receive additional savings on your school tax bill! Eligibility also requires that your income be less than \$86,000 (IRS Form 1040: adjusted gross, line 37, minus IRA distributions, line 15b).

To do this, you must apply for the Enhanced STAR exemption by **MARCH 1, 2018** (taxable status date) even if your birthdate is after this date in 2018. Submit a completed, signed, form RP-425-E along with proof of age (driver's license, etc.) and your 2016 income information to the Assessors' Office.

Yes, bring your income documents with you, we make courtesy copies, if you're not sure you have the correct income documents, just bring everything! We'll gladly help you sort out what you really need.

It is important to note, that if you have previously applied (registered) for a STAR Credit Check, with New York State (NYS), Department of Taxation & Finance (DTF), either by calling NYS DTF or going online to register (because you were a new homeowner, on or after March 2, 2015), you do not

need to apply again.

NYS DTF will determine your added eligibility based on your registration information for age (they know your birthdate) and income eligibility (based on filed NYS tax return). We do recommend that anyone with questions should give our office a call (or stop in), as we would be happy to assist you in determining what action to take (or not).

#### STAR Credit Check vs. STAR Exemption

Commencing with the 2016 assessment roll year and going forward, legislative changes began transitioning the STAR program from an exemption to a credit check.

New STAR applicants re-

ceive a credit in the form of a check directly from New York State instead of receiving a school property tax exemption. Registration is required for anyone who bought your home after March 2, 2016.

The amount of your STAR benefit is the same regardless of how you receive it. Administration is through NYS DTF in Albany, any questions regarding your registration, are directed to call the registration phone number below. Although your local assessor's office will continue assist with any general questions about the process.

New Basic and Enhanced STAR applicants must register with the New York State Tax Department to receive a STAR check.

- Register anytime at www.tax.ny.gov/star - it just takes a few minutes
  - Must register by

July 1st to receive the credit check by September 1st; registrations made July 2nd or later are not guaranteed receipt by September 1st

 Property owners without access to a computer can register by phone weekdays from 8:30am to 4:30pm by calling: 1-518-457-2036

Homeowners who previously made application and are currently receiving (grandfathered in) a STAR exemption applied directly to their school tax bill are not impacted. You will still continue to receive the exemption on your school bill, which is administered locally for both the Basic and Enhanced STAR exemptions. As always, any questions? #### **School Taxes**

School tax bills will be mailed out at the end of August. If you are not in a bank escrow account, and do not receive your bill by the end of the first week of September, please call our tax office at 889-6129 so that we may send a duplicate to you. School taxes are a bit more complicated than Town/County taxes and have a much shorter window in which to pay.

If you are paying the bill in full, you have until October 1 to pay without interest, and until October 31 to pay with 2% interest added. Since the 1st lands on a Saturday this year, the interest free period date is extended to the next business day, which will be October 3rd. You should make your check payable to Virginia Ignatowski – Tax Receiver and either mail. or bring it to the Chili Town Hall, 3333 Chili Ave. After Oct. 31, payments are made to the Monroe County Treasurer and are to be mailed or brought to the County office at 39 W. Main St.

If you are going to pay in installments, the first payment is made to Virginia Ignatowski - Tax Receiver and is due by September 15 without interest, or by September 20, with 1% interest. This should be delivered to the Chili Town Hall. All of the other payments are then made to the Monroe County Treasurer and should be delivered to the County. If you are not sure of what you should do, or where you should go, the full instructions can be found on the back of the bill, or call our office for assistance.

We only accept cash or checks for tax payments. If you wish to pay by credit card, you can do so through www.monroecounty.gov, with an additional 3% charge. As a reminder, we do have a night deposit box to enable payment drop-off after hours and on weekends.

**NOTICE:** To control costs, tax receipts are only mailed to property owners in escrow or to those that check the box located on the front of your bill. All other property owners are requested to obtain their paid tax receipt by visiting the Monroe County website at www.monroecounty.gov through the following steps:

- A box on the upper right hand side of the county's home page is titled "Top On-line Services". Click on the first bullet "View / Pay Taxes Online".
- This opens the Real Property Portal. Read the agreement and click "I Agree".
- On the next screen click the calculator above the "View/Pay Taxes Online".
- On the next screen enter your address or the parcel ID number, and then click the "search" button.
- Your property information should then appear. At the top right of the screen click on the green button that says "Pay Property Taxes". While you are not paying your tax, this is how to see all of your tax information.
- At the very top left of the

next screen that opens you will see "School Statement", "Combined Town and County Tax Statement", "Duplicate School Statement" and "Duplicate Combined Statement". The first two are the original bills and the next two are the receipts for the most recent billing cycles. The payment information is at the bottom of the receipt. It will show the dates and amounts that have been received to date and an outstanding amount due if there is one.

Of course we understand that not everyone has a computer or the capability to retrieve their information online. If requested, we will still mail the receipt to you. Just be sure to indicate this desire by checking the box on the bill and mailing the entire bill to us with your payment.

#### On-line banking payments not recommended

On-line bank payments are highly discouraged and are done at your own risk. This is stated on the back of the bill. While this type of banking is an option many employ to pay their household bills, it is not recommended for time sensitive payments. Banks can take several days to send the check after the on-line request is made and they do not contain a post office postmark date. Subsequently, even though you may request that a check be mailed on or before a due date, if it does not actually arrive by the due date, it is considered late. If you wish

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Hours: Monday–Friday 9:00am-5:00pm to pay via this method, it is recommended that you do so with enough advance time to ensure that we receive it by the due date.

## Check your bank accounts

If you mail payment to us, please check your bank account after a couple of weeks to ensure that it was cashed. We have had several instances of checks never arriving, and presumably, were lost in the mail. Homeowners were then surprised to find that they were now late / delinquent in their tax payments and owed interest and penalty fees. Also, if you are in an escrow account, you should receive a receipt by the end of October. If not, please contact us. Banks can, and do, make mistakes. Both of these situations don't occur often, but when it does, it is far better to catch it early in the process.

## Hunting Licenses Hunting License General Information

- A hunter education course is required for anyone who cannot show proof that they have ever possessed a hunting license. For information on hunter education courses, call 1-888-HUNT ED 2, or visit http://www.dec. ny.gov/outdoor.
- Hunter education certificates and sporting licenses from all other states and countries are honored.
- Hunters wishing to bow hunt must take an additional bow hunter education course.
- Anyone 12 years of age or older must obtain a license to hunt.
- Hunters under the age of 16 must apply for a license in person, bring their birth certificate, and be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

#### **Residency Requirements:**

- For a resident license, a person must live in New York State for more than thirty days prior to the date of application.
- Land ownership does not make you a resident. Your residency must be your fixed, permanent, and principal home.
- If under 18, the residence of your parents or legal guardian is your residence.

#### What if I Lose My License?

- To replace a lost license, you may contact any license issuing agent; a \$5.00 fee for each license will be charged.
- To replace a lost tag, go to any license issuing agent. This includes a lost big game carcass tag set.
- Lost turkey permits are also replaced by any license issuing agent.

#### **Debris Pick-Up Program - Town Pick-up Schedule**

In general, the Town picks up brush and tree limbs on the schedule below. However, during times of increased service demand such as spring pickup season or after a severe storm, there will be delays which will impact the pickup schedule. For the latest information on the status of the pickup schedule, please contact the dispatch line at (585) 889-2630, prompt #2.

First & Third Full Week – (Starting on a Monday) North & West Chili - north from Chili Avenue and west from Chili-Coldwater Road.

Second & Fourth Full Week - East from Chili-Coldwater Road and south from Chili Avenue.

- Brush and tree limbs must be cut and stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the road. Please stack brush, logs, and shrubs separately. Limbs should be left as long as possible. Logs must be cut as short as possible. All material, except log pieces, will be chipped. Material not chipped will be collected by another vehicle, possibly the next day. Chips are available for reuse at the Highway garage storage area and by delivery to the home upon request. Leaf mulch is also available for reuse.
- Green waste, vines, weeds, sticks, and shrubs shall be piled separately for packer pick-up.
   PLEASE DO NOT BAG. WE WILL NOT PICK UP BAGS AND WE DO NOT PICK UP GRASS CLIPPINGS. Backyard composting is suggested.
- Metal items and white goods, EXCLUDING dehumidifiers, air conditioners, refrigerators, and freezers (unless Freon has been removed & Red Tagged). Please call your private hauler for details regarding those items.
- Rocks, concrete, brick, and dirt. Must be piled separately and not in pieces larger than 12". PLEASE DO NOT BAG.
- **Junk cars.** By appointment, and proof of ownership is required.

\*\*\*\*\*\*PLEASE HAVE ALL DEBRIS READY FOR PICK-UP ON THE SUNDAY EVENING PRECEDING YOUR WEEK OF SERVICE.

- No Tires must be off rims to be collected by your private hauler
- Do not place items in concrete gutters, ditches, or on top of storm drains
- Pile materials separately from items to be collected by your private hauler
- No contractor-generated tree debris
- Unreasonably large amounts of debris shall not be placed at the curbside without prior approval of the DPW. Please contact 889-6156 for help in this matter.
- · No construction debris or building materials
- No furniture, TVs, fuel tanks
- Residents having items which are considered hazardous waste material should call Monroe County Hazardous Waste at 753-7600 for information on disposal.

#### Wood Chips and Leaf Mulch

Wood chips and leaf mulch are available for re-use. Stockpiles are located behind the former Highway Garage in the lower parking area, past the tennis courts.

#### **Fall Leaf Collection**

The Town of Chili's leaf collection service runs from mid October through mid December. Residents should rake leaves close to, but not on the roadway surface. Do not include rocks. sticks or other debris in the leaf pile. Refrain from parking vehicles in front of leaves during leaf collection periods, as this makes it difficult to maneuver the equipment. Residents are asked to be patient as leaf collection can be slow due to the inclement weather, volume, or when the leaves actually come down.

#### **Christmas Tree Collection**

The Town of Chili offers free Christmas tree disposal and will be collected on the same schedule as the Debris Pick-up Program. If you prefer, you can drop off your Christmas tree at the former Highway Department, in the back parking lot, by the tennis courts. Just follow the signs.

### SNOW REMOVAL: FACTS AND TIPS

Street safety is the Town of Chili's Public Works & Highway Department's primary concern during the winter months. The Public Works and Highway Department treats the pavement and removes snow whenever road conditions call for these services. Residents should remember that all snow removal operations are essentially performed under emergency conditions. Our drivers work extended hours to ensure safe and effective snow removal. Please help the Department by following the Snow Emergency Tips and Reminders listed below:

• The Town of Chili has about

175 road miles to maintain. Each road requires at least 2 passes of the plow, adding up to more than 350 lane miles to plow.

- It may take 3 to 4 hours to complete a typical plow route. Accumulations will occur during this time— we ask that residents please be patient.
- Roads within Town are prioritized and treated and plowed in the following order:
  - Primary (Main-Line) Roads
  - Secondary Roads
  - Town Subdivision Roads & Cul-de-sacs
- Please move all vehicles off of the streets and cul-desacs during all snow storms that have the possibility of producing at least 3 inches of snow and abide by overnight parking restrictions.
- Please remember that the Town is not responsible for removing the wind row created by plowing past your driveway and is not responsible for the snow that accumulates around your mailbox.
- All snow plows angle the same way, to the drivers right, and plowing snow will get pushed into the ends of the driveways. The only way to avoid extra shoveling is to wait until the Town crews have gone by and/or have done their final clean-up on the street.
- Please do not place garbage and recycling containers in the street.
- Objects in the street are the biggest deterrent to efficient plowing operations. Remove all basketball backboards and other items from the Town right of way.
- Never pass a snowplow.
- Never assume the snowplow drivers can see you. Stay at

- least three (3) car lengths behind the truck. If you cannot see the driver in his mirrors, then he cannot see you either.
- Be aware that snowplows will on occasion backup up at intersections.
- If you use a snow blower to clear your driveway, do not blow the snow into the street.
- If you, or your contractor, use a snow plow to clear your driveway, do not push the snow into or across the road as this is dangerous to motorist and it is illegal.
- Clear catch basins near your home if possible allowing rain or melting snow to enter the drainage system rather than flooding the street.
- Consider shoveling around any fire hydrant in your neighborhood to clear it of snow.
- The Town will place snow markers at critical locations.
   Please feel free to add additional markers as necessary.
- Please reduce your speed while driving in snow and ice conditions. Speed is the #1 cause of most accidents during the winter.

#### **Mailboxes**

The Highway Department asks that residents keep their mailboxes in good condition throughout the year. Mailboxes that are neglected will surely be affected by our plows due to the heavy snow from our wing plows. Our drivers take extra measures to avoid mailboxes, but sometimes weather conditions restrict the driver's ability to avoid them. If your mailbox is damaged during snow removal, a post/stake and a standard size metal mailbox are the only replacements, regardless of what you had previously installed. The highway crew will repair any mailbox they damage, to serviceable condition, not necessarily a new mailbox.

#### **Building Department**

As summer winds down, and our spring/summer projects are nearing completion, it is important to arrange for final inspections to close out any open building permits on your property so a Certificate of Compliance can be issued. This is especially important for swimming pools, as it is required to test the alarms before they are removed and the pool covered for the fall/ winter season. Whether the project was done by a contractor or by the property owner, all permits have a closeout process in the Town of Chili. If a Certificate of Compliance has not been received or a final inspection on your project arranged, then chances are the permit is still open. Please note that Building Permits for additions, decks, sheds, etc. are valid for 18 months from issue date. Building Permits issued for swimming pools are valid for 3 months from issue date. Building Permits are subject to renewal fees if work is not completed within this time frame. No structure/ pool is to be used until a Certificate of Compliance is issued. If the project has been completed according to the approved permit plans call to arrange for a final inspection, by calling the Building Department at 889-6143. Note 24-hours notice is required for all inspections. If you're unsure as to where in the inspection process your permit is, give us a call to check the status and help you close out any open items before the fall/

winter weather sets in.

The Building Department recommends that prior to final payment to a contractor, the homeowner/property owner verifies that any and all permits and Certificates of Compliance have been issued. Too many times, unbeknownst to the homeowner/ property owner, final inspections are not completed and permits not closed out by the contractor. Typically, by then, it is too late to get the contractor to return to resolve any issues needed to achieve compliance as they have received final payment and fulfilling any contractual obligation is not the priority. Thus the responsibility of completing the final inspection and attaining the Certificate of Compliance becomes that of the homeowner/property owner. We encourage everyone to contact the Building Department at 889-6143 if you have any questions regarding open permits on your property.

In response to the numerous calls regarding "zombie" properties the Building Department has begun advising residents to register their complaints regarding property maintenance issues on foreclosures being maintained by the bank or its agents (property maintenance company) at (800)-342-3736; additional information is available at the following website: http://www.dfs.ny.gov/banking/pff.htm.

Residents can register complaints

(grass, property maintenance, rubbish etc...) as often as they wish for the same property or for any other properties The process is simple and takes approximately 10 minutes.

We have been asked as to whether the Town is able to maintain the property by mowing the grass, etc. Please be aware that absent the separate legal authority the Town does not enter private property. This includes bank owned or properties in foreclosure. Town Code Enforcement will still receive these complaints, taking the address and the nature of their complaint so that we may inventory delinquent properties. However, the Town's ability to be compensated for property maintenance on such properties has been constrained by Monroe County.

Prior to registering any vacant property, it is important to verify that the property is actually vacant (defined by §1309(2) of the Real Property Actions and Proceedings Law) and not still occupied by the homeowner, as we are still charged with code enforcement for owner occupied properties. The protocol for those properties still occupied by a resident is as follows; reach out to homeowners to discuss avenues to resolution, issue orders to remedy mandating time and compliance expected and finally legal enforcement.



#### Licensing

The town of Chili, in accordance with New York State Law, requires that all dogs 4 months of age and older be licensed. Dog owners who have a dog without a license could be issued an appearance ticket and be fined up to \$250. To avoid any possibility of this happening, a dog license can be obtained at the Town Clerk's Office, located in the Town Hall at 3333 Chili Ave.

#### In order to obtain a license, the following two items will be needed:

- Proof of a rabies vaccination.
- Proof of spay and neutering from your veterinarian or animal care provider.

The cost of a dog license is \$10 for neutered and spayed dogs and \$20 for non-neutered and non-spayed dogs. If you are 65 or older, the cost is \$5.50 and \$15.50, respectively.

### Dog Control Office

If for some reason you think your pet has ingested something they shouldn't have and are unable to contact your veterinarian, the Animal Emergency Service of rochester, located at 825 spruce white boulevard. is ready to take your calls concerning any animal mishaps or questions you may have. They can be reached 24 hours a day at 585-424-1277.

#### **Leash Law**

All dog owners must have their dog on a leash when they are walking them off their property, on Town sidewalks, roads, open areas or Parks. The dog must be equipped with a collar or harness that is attached to a leash. Both collar/harness and leash must be of sufficient strength to restrain the dog. and the leash shall be held by a person who has the ability to control and restrain the dog by means of the collar/ harness and the leash. Please be courteous of your neighbors while walking your dog. If your dog decides to do his 'business' on someone else's property, please remove the waste and dispose of it properly.



### Winter Health and Holiday Safety Tips for Your Dog

Bitter cold, numbing wetness, biting winds and salt can cause discomfort for our dogs. To keep your canine companion healthy and safe this winter here are a few guidelines:

- Wind chill causes colder conditions than your thermometer reads. Dogs shouldn't be left outside for extended periods of time. Even a half hour in frigid conditions can cause problems.
- Always make sure your dog has access to an appropriate shelter. Dogs also need relief from drafty floors and tile. Provide them with a blanket or pillow.
- Groom your dog on a regular basis. Shorthaired dogs get cold more easily.
   A coat or sweater will help keep them warm on frigid days.
- Trim excess hair from footpads and toes on longhaired dogs to make it easier to remove ice and snow from their paws.
- Towel or blow-dry their

- coat. If your dog gets wet during inclement weather, be sure to dry its fur to shorten any exposure to hypothermia.
- Never leave a dog alone in a vehicle during frigid temperatures. Leaving the car running while you are away from the car may seem like a good way to keep your dog warm, but exhaust fumes from the vehicle's engine can sometimes enter the interior of the car and cause your dog to be exposed to carbon monoxide poisoning, which can be lethal.
- Antifreeze is poisonous to your dog if ingested. Antifreeze that leaks onto driveways and roadways smells and tastes good to dogs. Please keep your dog clear of these areas.
- Always wipe your dog's feet after a walk to remove excess salt from their pads. If their pads become dry and cracked, a little petroleum jelly may be useful in moistening them.

- Like humans, sometimes our pets don't feel well.
   Before giving your dog an over-the-counter medication, be sure to consult your veterinarian first.
- Christmas plants such as holly, poinsettia and mistletoe are poisonous to your dog.
- Tinsel also poses a danger.
   Tinsel can obstruct your dog's intestines and cut off blood circulation.
- Placing lights on the lower branches of a Christmas tree should be avoided or minimized. The lights can become hot and burn your dog's mouth.
- Avoid using glass ornaments. As your dog gets curious and playful, these ornaments can break, causing harm to their foot pads as well as their mouth if picked up.
- Keep all candy and treats out of your dog's reach. Chocolate, alcohol, and marshmallows are harmful to your dog and can be toxic.







Meals on Wheels is a service that provides the valuable nutrition needed. To be eligible for this service a person must be:

- 60 years of age
- homebound
- living alone or with someone who is unable to prepare nutritious meals and/or is absent during the day.

Visiting Nurse Service has numerous meal programs. The meals, which are funded by the Office for the Aging, have a recommended donation of \$3.00 per meal.





#### Coming Soon to the CPL ~ Make a Story Room!

In memory of his father George and mother Mary, Vincent Cardella has made a generous donation to the Gates-Chili Rotary on the condition it be used for children's services at the Chili Library. George Cardella was a long-time member of the Rotary and a noted businessman in Chili.

In collaboration with the Rotary, the library is using the donation to renovate its Storytime Room. For 19 years the Room has remained unchanged. Since then new approaches to literacy have been introduced, such as STEM teaching tools, to engage youth in reading and in using the library. No longer will the room look like a nursery, but instead it is being adapted to be used by children and teens of all ages. Technology, including a 3D printer, will also be used to facilitate literacy, play, and learning at the Library. The renovation plans also include upgrades to furniture, shelving, and storage.

Storytime will always be an important component of Youth Services at the Library; but to better reflect how the room will be used, it will now be called the Make a Story Room. Renovations will be done soon. Please stop in and check it out!


