## From the Supervisor

TThere is a fine line between wanted development in a community, and maintaining the community's character. In Chili, we strive to assure both: maintaining what make Chili a great place to work, live, and raise a family while managing growth and the development it brings.

Every day I'm asked "where's Aldi's?'". Rest assured, they're on their way. Construction is proceeding rapidly on the remodeling of the K-Mart Plaza at the corner of Chili Avenue and Chili-Center Coldwater Road. Aldi will serve as the anchor of the plaza, joined by Dollar Tree, Big Lots, Pet Supply Plus, an Urgent Care facility, and a Dance Studio. The plaza is evolving from an empty shell to a bustling center of commerce.

Another common question is "what the heck is that big building going up on the west side of Union Street?" That construction site is the home of C and M Forwarding, a domestic freight forwarder with a 75 year history. The giant warehouse being constructed currently is approximately 300,000 square feet. It is the first of three buildings proposed for the site, all of similar size!
American Packaging, located on Beaver Road, is also expanding their Chili footprint. Phase II of their project is currently underway, bringing with it more than 50,000 square feet of manufacturing space. American Packaging is the world leader in soft packaging.

The airport corridor is experiencing a boom of its own. One building is going up on Aviation Avenue, where Curbell Plastics
is constructing a new facility. Curbell has been one of America's premier suppliers of plastic products since 1942. Another project is Western Concrete, a concrete construction company with more than 20 years'
 experience. They plan to construct a 70,000 square foott equipment storage facility on Airline Drive.

Voters approved the construction of a new Chili Community Center in 2018. Site work has begun on this $\$ 20 \mathrm{~m}$ facility that will house Chili Recreation, Chili Senior Center, and the Chili Public Library. The Community Center is located behind Target, and is accessed via the road through Memorial Park. As the project moves forward, access to the area will be limited in consideration of resident safety around the construction site. We will be installing a construction camera at the location too; this will allow residents to check out the progress on the facility from the safety of their homes by visiting http://www.townofchili.org.

# Are You Living in a Landmark?

Have you ever wondered if your vintage home might be considered a landmark? Although some believe that the sole criterion for a landmark is age (and plenty of it), that is not completely accurate.

According to the latest guidelines from the Western New York Landmark Society newer homes should be considered. Some of these are the craftsman style, prairie style and, as well, early ranch style homes. One of the requirements is that, as much as possible, the front of the house should reflect the original building properties and stylistic cues.

Today, as in the past, many
homeowners enjoy perking up their homes with fresh paint or siding, new shutters, gutters and landscaping. If you're interested in investigating your home's landmark possibilities, these improvements do not prohibit you from investigating its landmark potential.

Not as important is your home's interior where, obviously, your family wishes to be as comfortable as possible. If, for example, you've modernized that allimportant room, the kitchen, that's acceptable and will not disqualify your home. Similarly, an addition or deck at the rear of the home is not a disqualifier.

To quote Phil Supernault,
chairman of the Chili Historic Preservation Board, "One of the reasons this board exists is to promote civic pride by investigating, promoting and securing the architectural history of this place we call home."

Because prospective landmark owners might have many questions about their properties, the Chili Historic Preservation board stands ready to aid you in pursuing answers.

Therefore, we are inviting members of the Chili community who are interested in exploring their homes and their significance to join us on Monday, June 10, 2019 at 7
pm in the Main Meeting Room at the Chili Town Hall, located at 3333 Chili Avenue. Experts and other landmark owners will be present to help you begin or continue your investigative voyage.

## Real Property Tax Cycle Significant Dates

Each year the Town of Chili Assessment Office prepares and publishes an assessment roll, which is used to determine each individual property owners portion of the tax levy for the school tax bill and the combined Town \& County tax bill. The amount of the levy is determined based on the budget requirements for Town, County \& School. The Assessment Office does not establish tax rates. The function of the Assessment Office is only to establish the value of your property and administer any exemptions, where eligibility has been met.

- January 1st - Town \& County property tax bills are issued.
- March 1st - Taxable Status Date, exemption filing deadline; this date applies to new applications and any exemption required to do an annual renewal for continued eligibility. Also by law, property condition and ownership are determined as of this date.
- May 1st - Tentative assessment roll is published; at this time the assessor may no longer make changes to assessed values; only changes that can be made are through the grievance process with the Board of Assessment Review.
- 4th Tuesday in May - Board of Assessment Review (BAR) meets to hear complaint (grievances) on assessments.
- July 1st - Final assessment roll is published for the current year; properties are valued as of the previous July 1st (valuation date), as set by law (July 1, 2019, valuation date is July 1, 2018).
- September 1st - School tax bills issued.
- October 1st to 31st -

Exemption renewal forms are mailed to property owners; renewal forms and their supporting documentation are due no later than taxable status date (March 1st).
Ultimately it is the responsibility of the property owner to review and verify that their property inventory published on the tentative roll (May 1st) is accurate and report to the Assessor (in a timely manner) of any errors for change or corrections or to file grievance with the Board of Assessment Review.

Taxable status date, Volume 8 Opinion of Counsel SBEA No. 5, RPTL §320 and §500; assessments must be based upon the condition and ownership of property as of taxable status date even if that date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday; however, in the event of such as the filing of an application for exemption, is extended until the next business day.

Both the tentative and final assessment rolls are published and placed on the Town webpage (required by law) and available in the Assessment Department during business hours.

## Assessment Review Informal Review

The informal assessment review process allows owners to submit documentation to the Assessor for review of their property's assessment. All informal reviews may require an interior/exterior inspection of the property by the Assessor or an Assessment Department staff member. The purpose of a physical inspection is to ensure that the inventory (square footage, room counts, etc.) on the assessment records are accurate and to evaluate the physical condition of the property - all of which may affect the outcome of value.

Property owners who disagree
with their assessment must supply information to support their requested value. Information provided to the Assessment Department from the property owner needs to include data on what is relevant to their property's value. Examples: A recent appraisal; a recent listing of the property showing asking price, time on market, etc.; a recent sale of the property; recent sales of similar properties in the subjects neighborhood; photographs showing aspects of the property that affect value.

Informal reviews may also occur as part of the Town's annual update process, when the assessor mails out Preliminary Change of Assessment notices, usually between February and April. A set period, defined within any notices sent, will be made available to schedule an Informal Review to discuss the proposed assessment change.

All decisions made through the informal process will be for the next available Tentative Assessment roll, published May 1st. Change of Assessment Notices resulting from an informal review will be sent to property owners no later than the first week in May.

## Formal Review - Board of Assessment Review

If a property owner is dissatisfied with the assessment for their property, or the results of an informal review, they may appeal to the Board of Assessment Review on Grievance Day, which is the fourth Tuesday in May each year. This year, the date is on Tuesday, May 28, 2019.

Meeting with the BAR is an opportunity for you, the property owner, to present to an impartial community board, information concerning the value (assessment) of your property. CONTINUED on Page 4...

To schedule an appeal, a completed complaint package, to include form (RP-524) with supporting documentation, along with five copies of the complaint package. All must be filed with the Assessor's office no later than the day the BAR meets for Grievance. However, property owners are asked to submit their complaint package(s) to the assessor's
office at least three business days prior to Grievance Day.
Appointment scheduling will begin on May 1st for Grievance Day (May 28th). Times are scheduled, upon receipt, in a "next available" basis. Each appointment will be a 10-minute period and walk-in's on Grievance Day will be given the next available appointment. By law, appointments cannot be taken after May 28th.

## Are you turning 65 in 2020? Or possibly you've already turned 65? Would you like to see if you could save more on your school taxes?



First things first...Happy Birthday! If you are already receiving a Basic STAR exemption and will be turning 65 in the calendar year 2020; that means your birthday occurs on a day between January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020; then you may be eligible to receive additional savings on your school tax bill!
To do this, you must apply for the Enhanced STAR exemption by MARCH 1, 2020 (taxable status date) even if your birthdate is after this date in 2020. Submit a completed, signed, form RP-425-E and RP-425-IVP along with proof of
age (driver's license, etc.) and your 2018 income information to the Assessors' Office. To meet eligibility, income must be under $\$ 86,300$.
Yes, bring your income documents with you, we make courtesy copies, if you're not sure you have the correct income documents, just bring everything! We'll gladly help you sort out what is really needed.

It is important to note, that if you have previously registered for a STAR Credit Check, with New York State (NYS), Department of Taxation \& Finance (DTF), either by
calling NYS DTF or going online to register (because you were a new homeowner, on or after March 2, 2015), you do not need to apply again.

NYS DTF will determine your added eligibility based on your registration information for age and income eligibility (based on filed NYS tax return). We do recommend that anyone with questions should give our office a call (or stop in), as we would be happy to assist you in determining what action to take (or not).

## STAR Credit Check vs. STAR Exemption

Commencing with the 2016 assessment roll year and going forward, legislative changes began transitioning the STAR program from an exemption to a credit check.

New STAR applicants receive a credit in the form of a check directly from New York State instead of receiving a school property tax exemption. Registration is required for anyone who bought your home, on or after March 2, 2015.

The amount of your STAR benefit is the same regardless of how you receive it. Administration
for a STAR credit check is through NYS DTF in Albany, any questions regarding your registration, are directed to call the registration phone number below; your local assessment office will continue to assist with general questions about the process.

New Basic and Enhanced STAR applicants must register with the New York State Tax Department to receive a STAR check.

Register anytime at www.tax. ny.gov/star - it just takes a few minutes

Property owners without access
to a computer can register by phone weekdays from 8:30am to $4: 30 \mathrm{pm}$ by calling: $1-518-457-$ 2036

Homeowners who previously made application and are currently receiving (grandfathered in) a STAR exemption applied directly to their school tax bill are not impacted. You will still continue to receive the exemption on your school bill, which is administered locally for both the Basic and Enhanced STAR exemptions. As always, any questions? ## Cold War Veterans Exemption - Town Taxes

February 13, 2019 saw the Town Board of Chili enacted Local Law \#1 of 2019, which adopts the Real Property Tax Law §458b Cold War Veterans Exemption for purposes of town taxes.

Commencing with the 2019 assessment roll, this adoption directs the Assessor to include the cold war veterans exemption under $\S 458$-b to the $10 \%$ option, or limit of $\$ 8,000$ in assessed value (whichever is less) and $\$ 40,000$ limit on CW veterans disability.

ALL current existing Cold War veteran applicant's, on file with the Assessment Office, will see this automatically applied for the next Town \& County tax bill cycle; this office will administratively update the assessment roll to reflect this change, ensuring proper calculations for the 2020 T\&C tax bill.
Any new eligible applicants for the Cold War Veterans Exemption will automatically receive this change and moving forward with future tax bills.

## Alternative Veterans Exemption - School Taxes

The Gates Chili Central School District Board of Education voted at the February 26, 2019 meeting to approve a proposal that gives partial tax exemption for veterans of wartime and combat zone/theater.

This change in exemption administration will commence with the 2019-20 school tax bill; there will be no additional paperwork required, as the Chili Assessment Office will administratively update the assessment roll for each existing Alternative Veterans exemption. Future applicants that are determined to be eligibility will automatically be coded to receive the school tax bill benefit upon processing.

Caledonia-Mumford and Gates Chili are the only school districts within Chili to adopt the veterans exemption option for school taxes. Veterans may contact this office for assistance with any questions regarding veterans exemptions.

## Tax Collection

The 2019 Town and County Tax collection period is nearing its end. We are still collecting taxes at the Chili Town Tax Office, 3333 Chili Avenue, Rochester, NY 14624, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, until May 31, 2019.

Payments made April $1-30$ have $4.5 \%$ interest applied. This increases to 6\% for any payments made May $1-31$. Taxes that are unpaid by April 30th will receive a
second notice of taxes due from the County and will incur an additional fee of two dollars (\$2.00) which will be levied and added to the tax bill. Payments through May 31 are payable to Virginia Ignatowski, Tax Receiver and are mailed to the above address.

After May 31, 2019 all unpaid taxes, plus interest, is payable to the Monroe County Treasury, 39 West Main Street, Rochester, NY 14614.


## Solicitors

With the return of nicer weather, there likely will be an increase in activity by door-todoor salespeople of products or services. Anyone peddling/ soliciting must first obtain a permit from the Clerk's office. (Fundraising is exempt from this law, i.e. - school fundraisers and scouts.) Only answer the door if you are comfortable doing so! You should request a business card and then to see their Chili permit. If they do not have one, you should contact the sheriff's office, as it is illegal for them to sell without one. Please also contact the Clerk's office at 889-6127. To assist in enforcement, it is helpful if you are able
to supply the name of the individual as well as the company they represent. This is why it is critical that you obtain a business card prior to any other interaction.

This law exists as an effort to protect residents from unscrupulous individuals. When a person applies for a peddler's permit at the Clerk's office, they pay a fee and must provide a background check on themselves. The Clerk researches them, and their company, to assess their credibility and business practices. In the past, applications were denied due to red flags such as poor BBB ratings, Attorney General Filings, news articles on problems encountered in
other communities, etc.
People have questioned if this law also applies to religious organizations going door-to-door or politicians campaigning, and the answer to both of those is no, it does not as they are not selling anything.

If you have a bad experience with a legitimately licensed solicitor, please let the Clerk's office know. Their license may be revoked if multiple complaints are received. In addition, future applications will meet with much stronger scrutiny.

## New York State Marriage Licenses Where to Obtain:

A couple intending to marry in New York State must apply in person for a marriage license. They may do so at any town or city clerk in the state.

The Chili Town Clerk's Office is located at 3333 Chili Ave. Licenses are issued between 9:30 A.M. and 4:30 P.M. We encourage that you call for an appointment to ensure staff availability.

It generally takes about 15 minutes to obtain your license. Both parties must be present. Blood tests are no longer required.

Both parties in the presence of the town or city clerk must sign the application for a license. A representative cannot apply for the license on behalf of the couple. This applies even if the representative has been given the Power of Authority.

Documents Required to Obtain a License:
A person must establish proof of age and identity to the issuing clerk with two documents. Our preference is:

One of the following agerelated documents:

- Birth Certificate
- Baptismal record
- Naturalization record
- Census record

And one of the following identity-related documents:

- Driver's license
- Passport
- Employment picture ID
- Immigration record

If previously married, a certified copy of the Decree of Divorce or a Certificate of Dissolution of Marriage is required for every divorce, including judgements of divorce.

If a spouse is deceased, a copy of the death certificate is required.

The marriage license is valid 24 hours after issuance and is only valid for sixty (60) days.

## Cost to Obtain:

The fee for the license is $\$ 40.00$. We accept cash, check, Visa, Master Card and

Discover. Please note that credit cards incur an additional third party fee of $\$ 1.75$, so if wish to avoid this additional amount, you should come prepared with cash or check.

The fee includes the issuance of a Certificate of Marriage which is sent to the applicant within 15 days after the license is returned by the officiate (person who performs the ceremony).

## Where to Obtain Copies of Marriage Records:

Marriage records are kept in the office that issued the original license. If you obtained your license at the Chili Town Clerk's Office and require a Certified Transcript of Marriage, please remit a notarized Marriage Research Form (available on the town website) or visit the Town Clerks Office.

The fee for a Certified Transcript of Marriage Certificate is $\$ 10.00$.

## Regarding all transfers of titles:

It is the responsibility of the property owner (either seller or buyer) to ensure that all construction and structures are compliant with all codes, laws and regulations. Any violations are the responsibilities of subsequent owners.

## P00LS

The Town of Chili Building Department's charge is to ensure the health, general welfare, and safety of the residents and with that responsibility, letters will be sent to all residents who have applied and received pool permits but not yet completed their final inspections. These letters will give residents an opportunity to make arrangements to complete the permit requirements and avoid further action by the Town.

## FENCES

While fences do not require a permit, there are restrictions per the Code of the Town of Chili:

- The height of a fence shall be the measurement from grade level to the top of the fence and/or post.
- Fences located in the rear/ side yard can be a maximum six foot in height.
- Fences in the front of the yard can be a maximum four foot in height.
- If your property is a corner lot, you have TWO front yards.
- Fences are allowed to be built to the property line. However, the owner must be able to maintain the fence without entering adjacent properties.
- Consult your instrument survey or a surveyor to determine property lines.
- Fences located in any easement are prohibited.

Construction in an easement requires authorization from the easement holder.

- The face side of any fence shall face the adjacent property. All posts, etc. shall be located on the inside of said fence.
- All Commercial/Industrial properties require a fence permit.


## IS A BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED?

Building Permits are required for most projects, including:

- Pools - Above ground \& inground
- Decks - Attached \& free standing
- Whole house generators
- Finishing a basement
- Additions
- Sheds over 119 sq. ft.
- Adding a bathroom

There are setback requirements regardless of whether a building permit is required.
Please call the Building Department at (585)889-6143 to verify if a building permit is required for a project you may be considering.

## DOINEED ACONTRACTOR?

This depends on the scope of the project and your skill level. If the scope of work surpasses your skill level, it might be worthwhile to hire a contractor. When applying for a building permit you must provide the contractor's name and contact information. We will verify that the contractor has the mandatory insurance coverage on file. Plumbers are required to be licensed with the Town of Chili. If your project includes installing new or relocating existing drain and/or supply lines, a licensed plumber is required.

## I AM DOING THE PROJECT MYSELF, DO I NEED INSURANCE?

As a homeowner you may choose to do the project yourself. In order to apply and receive a permit you will need to go online and register for a Workman's Comp Insurance exemption (CE200) from NYS. There are complete instructions available at the Town of Chili Building department office. Note, most if not all plumbing work requires a licensed plumber.

## CAN YOU RECOMMEND A CONTRACTOR?

We refrain from making specific recommendations on contractors but there are some basic guidelines to follow.

## HOW TO FIND A CONTRACTOR

- Ask a friend/neighbor
- Check with the Better Business Bureau (BBB)/ Better Contractors Bureau (BCB)
- Check with the Rochester Homebuilders Association


## SOME THINGS TO CONSIDER WHEN CHOOSING A CONTRACTOR:

- Check for the contractor's experience in the type of construction proposed.
- Interview the contractor and check the contractor's references.
- Check the reliability of your chosen contractor with the State Attorney General's Office and the Better Business Bureau.
- Arrange a contract and ensure the contract covers all the work, including who prepares drawings and who arranges inspections.
- Before signing the contract,

check the drawings to ensure they comply with what you want. In addition, check specifications and materials proposed.

- Define any type of warranty that is being given, you may wish to obtain legal counsel before signing.
- Determine who is obtaining the building permit, contractor or homeowner. No matter who applies for the permit, a permit card should be prominently displayed, PRIOR to any work is started.
- Ensure you have been informed of any additional requirements by the Building Department that have been included as part of the permit.


## WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR APPLYING FOR THE BUILDING PERMIT - THE HOMEOWNER OR THE CONTRACTOR?

Your contractor may apply for the permit. However, as the property owner, you are legally responsible to ensure that a building permit has been obtained. Note, swimming pool permits are valid for 90 days from date of issuance. All other building permits are valid for 18 months from date of issuance. We highly recommend that you receive a copy of the administered permit from your contractor prior to start of your project.

## CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY/COMPLIANCE

Your project is not complete until a final inspection is performed by this office AND a Certificate of Occupancy or Certificate of Compliance has been issued. It is the homeowner's legal responsibility to ensure a building permit has been
issued, inspections performed and Certificate of Occupancy/ Compliance issued prior to building permit expiration.
It is a recommendation that final payment is made, only after a final inspection by the Building Department AND a Certificate of Occupancy/Compliance has been issued. Doing this will ensure the work has been inspected and complies with all applicable codes.

## VACANT/ZOMBIE PROPERTY COMPLAINTS

Spring exposes properties that are potential blights escalating frustrations between neighbors or neighbors to absentee property owners (i.e. foreclosure, abandoned or unattended estates). The following are the criteria Code Enforcement utilizes to begin the assessment and enforcement process.

1. The Town can only cite violations visible from the public realm. Absent the separate legal authority, the Town does not enter private property. Alleged violations seen from neighboring properties are possible with the written consent of the neighboring property owner.
2. The Town will not accept anonymous complaints. Complaints must be in writing, signed by the complainant and submitted to the Building Department. In the case of legal enforcement, testimony by the complainant may be required.

Recent legislation at the State level now affords any citizen the ability to register any property that is currently in the foreclosure process, either owned by a financial institution or maintained by a third party under contract with a financial institution. To
register a property go to www.dfs. gov. Proceed to the Consumers tab, from the drop down menu pick "File a Complaint". Click on the "Consumer Complaint Form" to fill out the questionnaire form regarding your complaint. The Town is limited in enforcement actions afforded them on these properties, whereas the enacted legislation gives the State the ability to levy fines and stimulate action at a higher level of authority.
Owner occupied properties remain the charge of Code Enforcement for the Town of Chili. The protocol to achieve compliance is as follows; reach out to property owners to discuss mutually agreeable avenues for compliance. If compliance is not achieved within the agreed upon timeframe an Order to Remedy is issued mandating time and compliance expected and lastly legal enforcement. This protocol shall be the same for all properties within the Town of Chili.

## Warm Weather Tips

With the summer months just around the corner, you will surely find yourself spending extra time outdoors with your dog. Along with the fun, there are some precautions that should be taken. Here are some tips on how to help your dog enjoy their summer.

- Provide plenty of water and shade for your dog while they are outside.
- Dogs need exercise even when it is hot, but extra care needs to be taken with older dogs, short nosed dogs, and those with thick coats. On very hot days, limit exercise to early morning or evening hours. Keep in mind the asphalt gets very hot and can burn their paws.
- With more time being spent outside, make sure your dog is always wearing their collar and dog license should they find themselves separated from you.
- It is quite possible for your dog to suffer from heat exhaustion and heat stroke. These conditions are very serious and could be fatal. In hot weather, keep on the lookout for signs of heat stress, which could include heavy panting, glazed eyes, a rapid pulse, unsteadiness, vomiting or a deep red or purple tongue. If your dog becomes overheated, immediately lower their body temperature by moving them into the shade and
applying cool (not cold) water over their body to gradually lower their core body temperature. Let them drink small amounts of water or lick ice cubes. Most importantly, get them to a veterinarian immediately.
- Never leave your dog unattended in a parked car. On warm days, the temperature in your car can rise to dangerous levels in minutes, even with the windows slightly open and even when the temperature outside seems cool. If you see a dog in a parked car in the summer, alert the management of the store so they can page the owner of the vehicle. If the owner does not respond promptly, please call 911 and they will contact our office immediately.



## Don't Be Lost When Your Dog Is

One of the scariest moments we may face as dog owners is when our furry friend gets lost. It is an emotional time and most people don't know where to begin. Here is a checklist to help reunite you and your dog:

- File a report with your local Town's Dog Control or Animal Control Office, as well as any neighboring towns.
- Call the surrounding local Animal Veterinarian Clinics
- Check with your neighbors or homes around the area where the dog was lost.
- Look inside sheds, garages, and storage spaces in case the dog is trapped inside (particularly in cold weather)
- Make fliers and post around your neighborhood and where they were lost (including a photo, and any unique characteristics)
- Post on social media if that is comfortable and monitor listings in the 'lost + found' and the 'pets' section on Craigslist or Rochester Dogs lost or found.
One of the best ways to quickly find and be reunited with your animal is to be prepared before hand:
- Microchip your dog and keep your registration information current. (Dog Control and Animal Control Agencies have chip scanners and can scan your pet for a chip and call the agency that your chip is registered to)
- Keep license tags, collars and identification name tags on your dogs, they can be quickly identified and returned quicker with these things in place.
- Have good photographs of your animals, including distinguishing markings.

## RABIES VACCINATION cliNic娄 <br> Town of Chili's Free Rabies Clinic

It's spring time and once again the Town of Chili is holding its annual Free Rabies Clinic. You do not have to be a town resident to participate in the clinic, all are welcomed. All dogs and cats must be 3 months of age or older to receive a rabies vaccine. A one year rabies vaccine will be given unless prior proof of vaccination is shown. A three year rabies vaccination will be given if a previous or current rabies certificate is shown. A certificate is the only legal form of proof. For safety reasons, please keep all dogs on leashes and all cats in carriers. The Rabies Clinic will be held at the Town of Chili Highway Department at 200 Beaver Road; Saturday, June 22nd 2019, from 9:30 am till 12:00 pm. Westside Animal Care once again will be on hand for anyone who would like to have their pet micro chipped. The fee for the micro chipping is $\$ 35$ dollars (cash or check only). The chip will be pre-registered for you by Westside Animal Care for the life of your pet. If you have any further questions please feel free to contact the Dog Control Office at 889-6175.

## Licensing

We are also providing the opportunity for any Chili resident who has not licensed their dog(s) with the Town of Chili the chance to do so during the Rabies Clinic on Saturday, June 22nd, 2019 from 9:30 am till 12:00 pm at the Town of Chili Highway Department at 200 Beaver Road.


It is a New York State Law that all dogs 4 months of age and older be licensed in the municipality that they reside in. What you will need:

- Proof of a rabies vaccination.
- Proof of spay and neutering from your veterinarian or animal care provider.
- The cost for dog licensing is $\$ 10.00$ for neutered and spayed dogs and $\$ 20.00$ for non-neutered and non-spayed dogs.


## Pet Friendly Fourth Of July tips

- It is safer to keep your pets at home during Fourth of July celebration. Keep your pets in the house, rather than in your yard. He will be a lot happier indoors, and not tempted to leap over a fence to find you.
- Dogs can be startled by the loud noise of fireworks. Once the festivities begin, keep your pet in a safe room where he can feel comfortable. If your pet is crate trained put them in their crate covered with a blanket to make them feel secure.
- Block outside sights and sounds by lowering the blinds and turning on the television. Play soothing music in the background to
counteract the sounds of the "rockets' red glare.
- If your pet seems overly anxious, spend some time with your pet, speaking soothingly to help them to relax.
- Avoid scraps from the grill. While tempting to our pets, any sudden change to your pets' diet can cause stomach upset. In addition, some certain foods like onions, avocado, grapes and raisins can be toxic .
- Human products can be dangerous to animals. Avoid spraying your pet with insect repellent and only use special sunscreen that is intended for animal use. Keep your pets away from matches and lighter fluid. They can be extremely irritating to the stomach, lungs and central nervous system, if ingested.
- Should your pet become scared and run away, please contact your local Animal or Dog Control Shelter.
- Make sure you securely a fix your dogs license tag to their collar. A name tag for Fido's collar is also extremely helpful in the safe return. You may even consider micro chipping your pet. Most shelters and Veterinarian offices have chip scanners.
- Have a safe and happy Fourth of July.

- There is a leash law in effect in the Town of Chili. While dogs are off their property they must be secured by a leash no longer than six feet in length and in the owner's control. This assures everyone's safety as well as the control of your pet.
- This includes all of the Town of Chili's public parks and while on public roadways.
- Please be considerate and clean up after your pet while on walks and outing's.
- A friendly reminder for our Town's Union Station Water Park. As we all know dogs enjoy the water. Unfortunately, this water park is to be utilized for humans only, so please refrain from allowing your pet in the water. This is for the safety of the residents utilizing the water park and is a Monroe County Health Department regulation. If you are found to be in the water park with your pet, you will be asked to leave.
- If you as a resident suspect animal cruelty we ask you to contact the Humane Society Law Enforcement at Lollypop Farm. The Animal Cruelty Hot Line number is (585)223-6500. The Humane Society enforces all the Animal Cruelty Laws in New York State. The Town of Chili Dog Control Office is happy to discuss the situation with you and guide you through this process.

## DEBRIS PICK-UP PROGRAM

## Town Pick-up Schedule

In general, the Town picks up brush and tree limbs on the schedule below. However, during times of increased service demand such as spring pickup season or after a severe storm, there will be delays which will impact the pickup schedule. For the latest information on the status of the pickup schedule, please contact the dispatch line at (585) 889-2630, prompt \#2.

First \& Third Full Week - (Starting on a Monday) North \& West Chili - north from Chili Avenue and west from Chili-Coldwater Road.

Second \& Fourth Full Week - East from Chili-Coldwater Road and south from Chili Avenue.

- Brush and tree limbs must be cut and stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the road. Please stack brush, logs, and shrubs separately. Limbs should be left as long as possible. Logs must be cut as short as possible. All material, except log pieces, will be chipped. Material not chipped will be collected by another vehicle, possibly the next day. Chips are available for reuse at the Highway garage storage area and by delivery to the home upon request. Leaf mulch is also available for reuse.
- Green waste, vines, weeds, sticks, and shrubs shall be piled separately for packer pickup. PLEASE DO NOT BAG. WE WILL NOT PICK UP BAGS AND WE DO NOT PICK UP GRASS CLIPPINGS. Backyard composting is suggested.
- Metal items and white goods, EXCLUDING dehumidifiers, air conditioners, refrigerators, and freezers (unless Freon has been removed \& Red Tagged). Please call your private hauler for details regarding those items.
- Rocks, concrete, brick, and dirt. Must be piled separately and not in pieces larger than $12^{\prime \prime}$. PLEASE DO NOT BAG.
- Junk cars. By appointment, and proof of ownership is required.


## PLEASE HAVE ALL DEBRIS READY FOR PICK-UP ON THE SUNDAY EVENING PRECEEDING YOUR WEEK OF SERVICE.

All inquiries should be directed to the Department of Public Works Office at 889-2630, Monday - Friday between 7:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. NOTE: May through September, hours are Monday - Thursday 6:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Friday 6:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m.

- No Tires - must be off rims to be collected by your private hauler
- Do not place items in concrete gutters, ditches, or on top of storm drains
- Pile materials separately from items to be collected by your private hauler
- No contractor-generated tree debris
- Unreasonably large amounts of debris shall not be placed at the curbside without prior approval of the DPW. Please contact 889-6156 for help in this matter.
- No construction debris or building materials
- No furniture, TVs, fuel tanks
- Residents having items which are considered hazardous waste material should call Monroe County Hazardous Waste at 753-7600 for information on disposal.

Beaver Road, on Saturday, April 27, 2019 from 7:45 a.m. to 12:15 p.m.
This collection gives residents the opportunity to dispose of potentially hazardous chemicals in a safe manner and keeps usable items out of the landfills. Appointments are required at all Household Hazardous Waste Collections. Appointments for this HHW collection will be
accepted until Friday, April 26th. Waste from businesses will not be accepted.

## Acceptable Items:

Monroe County residents can bring up to 30 gallons of liquid (ex - paints) and 75 pounds of solids (ex - fertilizers, pesticides) per appointment at no charge. No 55-gallon drums will be accepted:

- Latex Paint (1/3 gallon or more ONLY)
- Oil-Based Paint, Oil-Based Wood Stain \& Preservatives.
- Automotive Fluids: antifreeze, brake, power steering and transmission fluids
- Pesticides, Fertilizers \& Insecticides
- Flammable Products: gasoline, kerosene, paint thinners, strippers, solvents, glues, etc.
- Household Cleaners: Soaps, waxes; chemical drain cleaners, etc.
- Driveway Sealers
- Pool \& Photo Chemicals
- Rechargeable (Ni-Cad) \& Button Batteries
- Mercury (thermometers, thermostats, fluorescent light tubes)
- Syringes/Sharps: packaged in clear 2-liter plastic bottles and labeled with SHARPS stickers available through pharmacies and Monroe County DES.
- Cooking Oil/ Cooking Grease

- Used Motor Oil \& Lead Acid Batteries (contact service station or retailer);
- Pharmaceutical Wastes (http://www.monroecounty.gov/ecopark/)
- Latex Paint ( $1 / 3$ full or less - if not dry: remove lid, put in kitty litter to absorb paint and let dry. Throw in trash. Applies to dried up paint cans as well);
- Propane Tanks (accepted at the Monroe County ecopark);
- Empty containers (place in trash or recycle);
- Everyday alkaline batteries (place in trash);
- Glazing/spackle \& joint compounds (place in trash);
- Asbestos (see Yellow pages under "Asbestos Abatement");
- Smoke Detectors (place in trash or contact manufacturer);
- Products intended for Industrial Use
- Explosives/Ammunition/Black or Smokeless Powder (Call 9-1-1)
- Shock Sensitive Materials (ex - crystallized ethers, picric acid - Call 9-1-1)

## Ballantyne Park

This is a two acre park located on Ballantyne Road, next to the Arc of Monroe County. Park amenities include a playing field and playground.

## Davis Park

Davis Park is a 52 -acre park that can be accessed from either Chestnut Ridge Road or Paul Road. Davis Park is home to six baseball fields, five soccer fields, two open air pavilions which are available for rent, restrooms, tennis courts, and two playground areas.

## Chili Community Center

The Community Center is located at 4400 Buffalo Road in North Chili. The property has a baseball field, basketball court, and playground.

## Memorial Park

Located at 3235 Chili Avenue, this 11.6 acre park is home to many playing fields, a basketball court, tennis courts, and a playground. ## Community Spotlight



The Lions Club of Chili provides free vision screening to children from six months of age on up in the Chili community. Once a parent signs the consent form the high technology camera simply takes a picture of the child. If there is a problem the attached computer prints out an information sheet detailing the issue. The parent then takes that form to the eye specialist for treatment.
Project Co-ordinator Bonnie Platt states that "For every 50 children we screen we have 4 or 5 kids who require a referral to an eye specialist. Parents are so grateful
that the problem has been detected early. They can't stop thanking us". Children cannot always verbalize that they have a problem seeing their world and their eyes change rapidly as they grow. Traditional testing using an eye chart is not as accurate as young children often cannot read letters. Last year several hundred children were screened at preschools, recreation centers, the Chili library and town holiday gatherings. Please call us 594-0649 if your group would like to have vision screening conducted.
