John and his brother used to be there as children. His brother carved his name on the door inside the milk house. John and the highway department were able to dismantle it in good condition. History saved!

Bonnie told a story of a lady from the 1800's who rented an apartment in what is now the Stagecoach Inn in the center of North Chili. Ogden telephone was putting up the poles up for the implementation of the first telephone lines in our town. The lady looked out of her window and was shocked at this strange occurrence. Not understanding the idea of the ability to speak into a device where her voice would be carried over distances far and wide, she wrote in her diary that "No good thing will come of this. It is from the devil." Years later she became ill. The telephone was used to help save her life.
