## from the **Supervisor**

The Town Newsletter is back, with more news you can use! Please pay special attention to this edition, as it has very important information on the programs and services we offer, and the limitations that the COVID-19 pandemic has imposed on them.

Did you know that while many Town's simply closed operations at the start of the pandemic, Chili continued to serve our community? Though our doors were largely closed to the public, our Department Heads as well as our Highway, DPW, and Parks crews continued their important work though on an altered schedule. The essential services they perform don't stop! I'd like to take this opportunity to commend our Town staff for their patience, cooperation, and resilience they demonstrated during this time. They never faltered and proved they are up to the task no matter the adversity.

The Chili Town Hall was one of only a few to reopen to the public as soon as it could be done safely. Though the pandemic has forced us to change the way we do some things with the implementation of occupancy limitations, social distancing, counter sneeze guards, and drive-thru services – our staff continues to "think outside the box" to "get it done". The ever-changing guidelines and the unknown has given us a new level of awareness on how we operate.

The COVID-19 pandemic has had other impacts on Town operations too. Revenues will be a concern for the foreseeable future. During my tenure as Town Supervisor we have continued to maintain a conservative stance in budgeting. This has proven to be ideal and

has allowed it to weather this storm, assuring our reserve funds are sufficient to get through times like these. Our budgeting



and financial status has allowed our services to continue as before, with minor modifications. The fall leaf collection, for example, will be slightly modified this year. Please read the details of those changes inside this edition.

In other, more exciting news, your Community Center is coming along nicely. For those unaware, the Community Center is the large facility under construction behind Target. It will house Chili Recreation, the Chili Senior Center, and the Chili Public Library. We still anticipate opening early this Spring.

This new facility brings with it new opportunity. Plans are underway to move the 2021 Chil-E fest to the grounds of the new Community Center. Plans include returning the festival to a two-day event, more vendors, more activities, more entertainment, and of course more of the best fireworks around! ## **Chili History**

### **1860** Ye Ole Milk House 1960

Our early ancestors started out with forty acres and a mule, as folklore would have it.

However, with families as large as 8 to 13 children, we soon recognized the cow was just as important.

Transition from the milk bucket to today's international transport of milk products in plastic containers has had an interesting "footprint". First known as "sweet milk" with heavy cream, we now have various choices and flavors. Science has exposed us to the benefits of milk and also its hazardous effects on some people.

Pre-Civil War rural farms were self-sufficient having (1) one or (2) two cows. Agriculture improved as small dairy farms, (10) ten or more milking cows, ventured into

sales of the milk products. This involved a-lot of work, necessary storage, and

transportation of produce.

The milk house became a structure of complexity to the cow barn. Sanitary or "whitewash" conditions were high priority along with storage and refrigeration of the product.

Cooling tanks with spring-fed water passing through it, while 100 Lbs. milk cans stood at

attention in the lower temperatures, was one system of refrigeration. Shade from the

American bamboo trees were another method.

Transport to market and sales were accomplished by: Milk buckets, cans, bottles and (1) one horse wagons. Progress and technology has met today's demands with refrigeration, 30,000 gallon tank trucks, milking parlors (24/7) and international sales.

The old milk houses are vacant now and in disrepair. A few have been converted into

tack rooms for riding horses, and/or office spaces as well as historical links. Several of said structures still exist through-out the Chili country side... However, one needs to look

hard for them. Much like the milk cans and bottles with our town's identity embossed upon them.

Global technology offers the viability for foreign countries to ship varieties of milk products world wide. It is difficult for one to believe that our ancestors would understand

that I can drink milk from New Zealand in the town of Chili today.









## **Assessor's Office**

### NEW!!! 2021 COVID-19 Exemption Renewal Process Changes!!!!!

These protocols have been established to provide a safe and secure environment for customers and staff alike. It is strongly advised if you are not mailing in or using the Night Drop Box, to schedule an appointment, as there will be no guarantees for available assistance on any given day for walk-in's (no scheduled appointment). If the calendar day is full, you will be requested to make an appointment and return on another day. If the calendar isn't full, efforts will be made to provide assistance that day. The Assessor and office staff will also attempt to reasonably accommodate various circumstances, upon prior notification, should a longer appointment time or different assistance be warranted.

DUE TO COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS AND SAFETY CONCERNS REMIT YOUR EXEMPTION RENEWAL FOR 2021 USING ONE OF THE FOLLOWING OPTIONS:

- 1. **Return by MAIL**; completed form and copies of supporting 2019 income data (as applicable)
- a. <u>Include a current contact phone</u> number; in case we need to call regarding anything pertaining to the returned exemption renewal
- b. Enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope if you wish a receipt for your records (highly recommended)
- c. FYI, if your exemption renewal requires copies of supporting data, such as income data and you wish to make or have copies of information made, Town of Chili Library has copying services available during hours of operation; there is a nominal fee for copies
- 2. <u>Use Town NIGHT DROP BOX</u>; put completed form & copies of supporting 2019 income data (as applicable) in an envelope addressed to ASSESSMENT OFFICE
- a. Location: Town Hall, 3333 Chili Ave, just to the left of front entrance
- b. See above "Return by MAIL" for added instructions
- 3. **BY APPOINTMENT**; to schedule an appointment call Assessment Office at

(585)889-6132; bring completed form(s) and all required supporting data (as applicable).

- a. Current COVID-19 safety measures allow for one customer at a time into office; entry into Town Hall will require you to <u>WEAR A FACE MASK</u>; efforts to accommodate special circumstances regarding mask-wear must be *identified prior to arrival*
- b. Exemption renewal(s) by appointment will be scheduled for a specific date at a specific time; staff will endeavor to accommodate a date and time best for you
- c. Appointments will begin on **Tuesday, October 13, 2020 thru Monday, March 1, 2021**; 30-MINUTE appointment times will begin sharply at 9:00AM with the last available time at 4:30PM; all renewals are DUE by taxable status date: <u>March 1, 2021</u>
- d. Courtesy copying of supporting documentation, for *scheduled appointments*, will still be available to customers
- e. DO NOT DELAY completing your renewal for 2021; for those exemptions requiring income data, the assessor **will not** be accepting 2020 income, **only the 2019**
- f. <u>BE PROMPT</u> & <u>BE PATIENT</u>, the appointment window allows for processing your data and allows staff to accomplish sanitization between visits; phone lines may be busy due to initial call volumes, please try back at a different time
- g. <u>CHECK THAT YOU HAVE ALL</u> <u>YOUR INFORMATION TOGETHER BEFORE</u> <u>YOU LEAVE YOUR HOUSE</u>, forms signed by all owners, supporting data is complete, etc.
- h. Incomplete forms (such as no signatures) or data (income forms) will require you to schedule another appointment to provide anything missing

## Real Property Tax Cycle - Significant Dates

Each year the Town of Chili Assessment Office prepares and publishes an assessment roll, used to determine each individual property owner(s) portion of the tax levy for the school tax bill and the combined Town & County tax bill.

The amount of the levy is determined based on the budget requirements for Town, County & School. The Assessment Office does not establish tax rates. The function of the Assessment Office is only to establish the value of your property and administer any exemptions, where eligibility is met.

Real Property Tax Cycle – Significant Dates Previous Year (2020)

• July 1 – Date of Valuation, as set forth by law, always July 1st of prior year.

Current Year (2021)

- January 1 Town & County property tax bills issued, uses prior year (2020) assessment roll data.
- March 1 \*Taxable Status Date, exemption filing deadline; by law, property condition and ownership are determined as of this date. Informal assessment reviews by appointment with assessor.
- May 1-2021 Tentative assessment roll published, by law the assessor may no longer make changes to assessments; only changes allowed are through the Board of Assessment Review
- Fourth Tuesday in May Board of Assessment Review (BAR) meets to hear complaint (grievances) on assessments. Last day to file a formal assessment complaint; applications due by 8:00PM on Grievance Day.

### 2021 Grievance Day is: Tuesday, May 25, 2021

- July 1-2021 Final assessment roll published. Forthcoming school (Sept 2021) and Town & County (Jan 2022) tax bills will use data from this roll to do calculation of taxes owed.
- September 1 School tax bills issued; current year assessment roll. All questions pertaining to tax bills are referred to the Town Tax Receiver's Office.
- October 1 Informal review cycle begins for 2022; exemption renewal forms are mailed for upcoming year (2022) and are due no later than taxable status date (March 1st).

Ultimately it is the *responsibility* of the property owner to review and verify that their property inventory published on the tentative roll (May 1st) is accurate and report to the Assessor (in a timely manner) of any errors for change or corrections or to file grievance with the Board of Assessment Review.

\*Taxable status date, Volume 8 Opinion of Counsel SBEA No. 5, RPTL §320 and §500; assessments must be based upon the condition and ownership of property as of taxable status date (March 1st) even if that date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday; however, in the event of such, as it pertains to the filing of an application for exemption, is extended until the next business day.

Both the tentative and final assessment rolls are published and placed on the Town webpage (required by law) and available in the Assessment Department during business hours.

## Are you turning 65 in 2021? Would you like to see if you could save more on your school taxes?

First things first... Happy Birthday! If you are already receiving a Basic STAR exemption and will be turning 65 in the calendar year 2021; that means your birthday occurs on a day between January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021; you may be eligible to receive additional savings on your school tax bill!

To do this, you must apply for the Enhanced STAR exemption by MARCH 1, 2021 (taxable status date) even if your birth date is after this date in 2021. Submit a completed, signed, forms RP-425-E and RP-425-IVP along with proof of age (driver's license, etc.) and your 2019 income information to the Assessors' Office. To meet eligibility, income must be less than \$\$90,550.

Yes, bring your income documents with you, we make courtesy copies; if you are not sure you have the correct income information, just bring everything! We will gladly help you sort out what is needed to determine eligibility.

It is important to note, that if you have previously <u>registered</u> for a <u>STAR Credit Check</u>, with New York State (NYS), Department of Taxation & Finance (DTF), <u>you are not eligible to apply for the exemption</u>. NYS DTF will determine your added eligibility automatically based on your registration information for age and income eligibility.

We do recommend that anyone with questions should give our office a call (or stop in), as we would be happy to assist you in determining what action to take (or not).

## **Building Department**

As summer winds down, and our spring/ summer projects are nearing completion, it is important to arrange for final inspections to close out any open building permits on your property in order to receive a Certificate of Compliance/Occupancy. This is especially important for swimming pools, as it is required to test the alarms prior to removal and the pool covered and closed for the fall/winter season. Whether a contractor or property owner completed the project, all permits must be closed out in the Town of Chili.

## WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR APPLYING FOR THE BUILDING PERMIT - THE HOMEOWNER OR THE CONTRACTOR?

Your contractor may apply for the permit. However, as the property owner, you are legally responsible to ensure that a building permit has been obtained. Note, swimming pool permits are valid for 90 days from date of issuance. All other building permits are valid for 18 months from date of issuance.

## CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY/COMPLIANCE

Your project is <u>not complete</u> until a final inspection has been performed by this office and a Certificate of Occupancy or Certificate of Compliance has been issued. It is the **homeowner's legal responsibility** to ensure a building permit has been issued, inspections performed and Certificate of Occupancy/ Compliance issued prior to building permit expiration.

No structure/pool is to be used until a Certificate of Compliance/Occupancy is issued. If the project has been completed according to the approved permit plans call to arrange for a final inspection by calling the Building Department at 889-6143. Note: 24-hours' notice is required for all inspections. If you are unsure as to where in the inspection process your permit is, give us a call to check the status and help you close out any open items before the fall/winter weather sets in.

### **IS A BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED?**

Building Permits are required for most projects, including:

- Pools Above ground & in-ground
- Hot tubs
- Sheds over 119 sq. ft.
- Decks Attached & free standing
- Whole house generators
- Finishing a basement
- Adding a bathroom
- Additions
- Demolishing an existing structure

## There are setback requirements regardless of whether a building permit is required.

- Building Permits for additions, decks, sheds, etc. are valid for 18 months from issue date.
- Pool and Hot Tub permits are valid for 3 months from date of issue:
- All building permits are subject to renewal fees if work is not completed within the allotted period.
- No structure/pool is to be used until a Certificate of Compliance/Occupancy is issued.

## WITH REGARD TO TRANSFER OF TITLES:

It is the responsibility of the property owner (seller or buyer) to ensure that all additions, accessory structures, pools, etc., are compliant with all codes, laws and regulations. *All violations become the responsibility of subsequent owners.* 

The Town recommends that you obtain a copy of the building permit from your contractor to verify issuance of a permit. Furthermore, request proof of a Certificate of Occupancy/ Compliance from your contractor for any permitted work prior to the final payment to the contractor. This will insure that the completed installation complies with all local and state building codes and the Town has closed out the project. Regardless of who applied, procured or paid for the permit the ultimate responsibility of the project close out is the property owner's.

### **PROPERTY MAINTENANCE COMPLAINTS**

- 1. One of our most common complaints is that of the condition of a neighboring property. While we understand, residents prefer to remain anonymous, doing so prevents code enforcement from properly following through with the complaint. Often times these complaints lead to legal action where the complainant will be called upon to testify.
- 2. The Town cannot accept nor respond to anonymous complaints. Complaints must be in writing, signed by the complainant and submitted to the Building Department. In the case of legal enforcement, testimony by the complainant may be required.
- 3. The Town can only cite violations visible from the public realm. Absent the separate legal authority, the Town does not enter private property. Alleged violations seen from neighboring properties are possible with the written consent of the neighboring property owner.
- 4. Once a violation has been assessed/confirmed, a Code Enforcement official will contact the property owner either inperson or in writing by issuing an Order to Remedy. Either of these methods will inform the property owner of the violation and prescribe a time for compliance. If compliance is, still not achieved legal enforcement can commence.

## **Dog Control Office**

#### **LICENSING**

The Town of Chili, in accordance with New York State Agricultural Markets Laws require that all dogs four months of age and older be licensed in the municipality that they reside in. This can be done at the Town of Chili Town Clerks Office located at 3333 Chili Avenue. In order to obtain a dog license you will need:

- An updated proof of rabies vaccination from your veterinarian
- Proof of spay and neutering from your veterinarian
- Cost of licensing is \$10 dollars for spayed/ neutered dogs and \$20 for un-spayed/ un-neutered dogs.



### **WINTER HEALTH AND SAFETY TIPS**

Harsh winter weather brings a wide variety of concerns to our fuzzy companions. Bitter cold, biting winds numbing wetness and salt can cause much discomfort for our special canines. To assure your fuzzy companion stays healthy and safe through our long harsh winter months here are some helpful guidelines:

- Wind chill causes colder conditions than what a thermometer reads. Dog's shouldn't be left outside for extended periods of times. Even a half hour in frigid conditions can cause problems with your furry companion.
- All dogs left outside must have adequate shelter appropriate to their breed, physical conditions and climate. This is the law.
- Trimming excess hair from footpads and toes can help with ice buildup on their furry paws.
- A coat can also keep our furry friends cozy and warm.
- Never leave dogs alone in a car unattended in frigid temperatures. Dogs like humans can die from hypothermia. If the motor vehicle is left running your dog may be overcome by carbon monoxide.
- Anti freeze is very toxic to dogs as well as animals. Please take extra precaution if there is a spill to clean it up. Antifreeze tastes and smells good to dogs.
- Like humans, sometimes our pets don't feel well. Before giving your dog and over the counter medication check with your veterinarian to see if it is safe for your pet to ingest.
- With the holidays right around the corner the are many foods that are delicious to us but not so good for our pets



### **DON'T BE LOST WHEN YOUR PET IS**

One of the scariest moments we may face is when our pet has gone missing. It's an emotional time for pet owners. Here is a check list to help reunite you back with your pet:

- Call your Towns Animal or Dog Control Office (Town of Chili-889-6175)
- Call surrounding local Animal Hospitals, frequently people will take a lost dog to a veterinarian to be scanned for a microchip.
- Look Inside sheds, garages and storage spaces in case the dog has inadvertently been trapped.
- Social Media has played a huge part in getting our lost pets home, for instance the Nextdoor app, Facebook,Lollypop Spotters and Craiglist just to mention a few.

## Some of the Best ways to quickly find Your pet is to be prepared before hand:

- Microchip your pet and keep the microchip currently registered.
- Keep license tags or a tag with your information on your pet's collar.

These simple tips will help in returning your pet quicker to you and lessen the anxiety that goes along with losing them.

### **IF YOU FIND A STRAY OR LOST DOG:**

Animal lovers sometimes find themselves coming across a stray or lost dog. Some helpful tips to reunite the stray with their owners:

- Call your local Dog/Animal Control Office this is one of the best ways to reconnect the dog with their owner.
- Check for tags on the dogs collar. If there is a license tag on the dog you can call your local shelter or Town Clerk to see who the owner is for that license tag.
- If there is a rabies tag on the collar you can call that number on the tag and find an owner for the dog.
  - Have the dog scanned for a microchip at your local veterinarian.
- Walk the dog around the neighborhood in which the dog was found, someone may be looking for them.
- Call 911, they will contact the on duty Dog Control Officer for that town and they will make sure the dog is safely picked up.


On behalf of all lost dogs and the families that are missing them, thank you to everyone who goes out of their way to make sure we reunite these pets back with their owners.

## AS A REMINDER TO ALL TOWN OF CHILI RESIDENTS

- There is a leash law in affect in the Town of Chili. While dogs are off their property all dogs are to be secured by a physical leash no longer than six feet in length and under the owners control. This assures everyones safety as well as control over your pet.
- This does include all Town of Chili Public parks and while on public rights-of ways.
- Please be considerate and clean up after your pet while on walks and outings.

### **School Taxes**

School tax bills were mailed August 31st. The full amount was due by October 1st without interest. If you are not in a bank escrow account, and never received your bill, please call our tax office at 889-6129 so that we may send a duplicate to you. A 2% late fee is assessed on full payments made October 2 - 31 and is collected by Virginia Ignatowski - Tax Receiver. You can either mail it to 3333 Chili Ave, Rochester, NY 14624, come in person (wearing a face mask), drop it in the night deposit box located to the left of the front doors, or pay online at Monroe County's website (instructions below). Payments made November 1 - November 18 incur a 5% late fee and should be sent to the Monroe County Treasurer at the County office at 39 W. Main St.

Second and third installments are payable to the Monroe County Treasurer and should be mailed to PO Box 14420, Rochester, NY 14614 or in person at 39 West Main St. These do NOT come to Virginia Ignatowski at the Chili Town Hall!

No payments are accepted after November 18. Any remaining school tax not paid by November 18 will be re-levied into your 2021 Town and County bill.

You can find all of your current and past tax information, in addition to paying your tax online, at the Monroe County website www. monroecounty.gov following these steps:

- A box on the upper right hand side of the county's home page is titled "Top On-line Services". Click on the first bullet "View / Pay Taxes Online".
- This opens the Real Property Portal. Read the agreement and click "I Agree".
- On the next screen enter your address or the parcel ID number, and then click the "search" button.
- Your property information should then appear. At the top right of the screen click on the green button that says "Pay Property Taxes". You do not have to pay your tax when you click this button. This just opens the next screen so that you can see all of your tax information. If you are paying your taxes, continue with the payment options offered on the next screen.
- At the very top left of the next screen that opens you will see "School Tax Bill", "Combined Town and County Tax Bill", "Current School Transaction Summary" and "Combined Town and County Transaction Summary". The first

two are the original bills and the next two are the receipts for the most recent billing cycles. The payment information is at the bottom of the receipt. It will show the dates and amounts received to date and an outstanding amount due if there is one.

• If you wish to see payment information beyond the current cycle, click on the payment history button at the bottom of the screen.

## Hunting Licenses available at the Clerks office

### **Hunting License General Information**

- A hunter education course is required for anyone who cannot show proof that they have ever possessed a hunting license. For information on hunter education courses, call 1-888-HUNT ED 2, or visit http://www.dec.ny.gov/outdoor.
- Hunter education certificates and sporting licenses from all other states and countries are honored.
- Hunters wishing to bow hunt must take an additional bow hunter education course.
- Anyone 12 years of age or older must obtain a license to hunt.
- Hunters under the age of 16 must apply for a license in person, bring their birth certificate, and be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

### **Residency Requirements:**

- For a resident license, a person must live in New York State for more than thirty days prior to the date of application.
- Land ownership does not make you a resident. Your residency must be your fixed, permanent, and principal home.
- If under 18, the residence of your parents or legal guardian is your residence.

### What if I Lose My License?

- To replace a lost license, you may contact any license issuing agent; a \$5.00 fee for each license will be charged.
- To replace a lost tag, go to any license issuing agent. This includes a lost big game carcass tag set.
- Lost turkey permits are also replaced by any license issuing agent.

### First Come First Serve DMP (Doe tags) sales start on November 1st.

### **Wood Chips and Leaf Mulch**

Wood chips and leaf mulch are available for re-use when we have a stockpile. Please call our Dispatch office at 889-2630 (option #2) for availability.

### **Fall Leaf Collection**

The Town of Chili's leaf collection service runs from mid-October through early December weather permitting. Residents are encouraged to compost leaves when possible. For residents desiring leaf pickup, they should rake leaves close to, but not on the roadway surface. Do not include rocks, sticks or other debris in the leaf pile. Refrain from parking vehicles in front of leaves during leaf collection periods, as this makes it difficult to maneuver the equipment. Residents are asked to be patient as leaf collection can be slow due to the inclement weather, volume, or when the leaves actually come down. As a result of budgetary impacts from COVID19, leaf collection will not be provided on weekends or holidays during the 2020 leaf season. The Public Works Department will provide periodic updates on the Town's website and via the Twitter feed on which streets we anticipate picking up next. These notifications will be approximate and areonly and meant as a general guide. The Town will not be picking up any remaining leaves once the 2020 pickup season ends or in the spring of 2021. As a reminder, residents may always drop-off leaves at 200 Beaver Road in a designated area in front of the building on the right side of the entrance. Contractor and bagged leaves are not permitted.

### New Debris Pick-Up Schedule

Effective January 4, 2021, the Town will be modifying the schedule for the brush and tree limb program in order to provide residents with a more consistent pickup rotation. While there may still be occasions that result in a delay, we feel that this new schedule will allow us to better manage the program and reduce delays during the peak spring clean-up season. As such, the current two (2) route system of alternating weeks will be modified into a four (4) route system, with each route being picked up the same week each month starting with the first Monday of the month. A route map and schedule will be posted on the website by December 15, 2020

and in the spring newsletter. Also, as in the past, you can call into the dispatch line at 889-2630, prompt #2 for the latest information.

### **Christmas Tree Collection**

The Town of Chili offers free Christmas tree disposal and will be collected on the same schedule as the Debris Pick-up Program. Should you have any questions, please feel free to call our Dispatch office at 889-2630 (option #2).

#### SNOW REMOVAL: FACTS AND TIPS

Street safety is the Town of Chili's Public Works & Highway Department's primary concern during the winter months. The Public Works and Highway Department treats the pavement and removes snow whenever road conditions call for these services. Residents should remember that all snow removal operations are essentially performed under emergency conditions. Our drivers work extended hours to ensure safe and effective snow removal. Please help the Department by following the Snow Emergency Tips and Reminders listed below:

- The Town of Chili has about 175 road miles to maintain. Each road requires at least 2 passes of the plow, adding up to more than 350 lane miles to plow.
- It may take 3 to 4 hours to complete a typical plow route. Accumulations will occur during this time— we ask that residents please be patient.
- Roads within Town are prioritized and treated and plowed in the following order:

Primary (Main-Line) Roads Secondary Roads Town Subdivision Roads & Cul-de-sacs

• Please move all vehicles off of the streets and cul-de-sacs during all snow storms that have the possibility of producing at least 3 inches of snow and abide by overnight parking restrictions.

## **Highway/Public Works**

- Please remember that the Town is not responsible for removing the wind row created by plowing past your driveway and is not responsible for the snow that accumulates around your mailbox.
- All snow plows angle the same way, to the drivers right, and plowing snow will get pushed into the ends of the driveways. The only way to avoid extra shoveling is to wait until the Town crews have gone by and/or have done their final clean-up on the street.
- Please do not place garbage and recycling containers in the street.
- Objects in the street are the biggest deterrent to efficient plowing operations. Remove all basketball backboards and other items from the Town right of way.
  - Never pass a snowplow.
- Never assume the snowplow drivers can see you. Stay at least three (3) car lengths behind the truck. If you cannot see the driver in his mirrors, then he cannot see you either.
- Be aware that snowplows will on occasion backup up at intersections.
- If you use a snow blower to clear your driveway, do not blow the snow into the street.
- If you, or your contractor, use a snow plow to clear your driveway, do not push the snow into or across the road as this is dangerous to motorist and it is illegal.
- Clear catch basins near your home if possible allowing rain or melting snow to enter the drainage system rather than flooding the street.
- Consider shoveling around any fire hydrant in your neighborhood to clear it of snow.
- The Town will place snow markers at critical locations. Please feel free to add additional markers as necessary.
- Please reduce your speed while driving in snow and ice conditions. Speed is the #1 cause of most accidents during the winter.

#### **Mailboxes**

The Highway Department asks that residents keep their mailboxes in good condition throughout the year. Mailboxes that are neglected will surely be affected by our plows due to the heavy snow from our wing plows. Our drivers take extra measures to avoid mailboxes, but sometimes weather conditions restrict the driver's ability to avoid them. If your mailbox is damaged during snow removal, a post/stake and a standard size metal mailbox are the only replacements, regardless of what you had previously installed. The highway crew will repair any mailbox they damage, to serviceable condition, not necessarily a new mailbox.



## **Highway/Public Works**

### **DEBRIS PICK-UP PROGRAM**

Intent of Town Pick-up Program: The Town provides a program for the pickup of brush and tree limbs. This program can accommodate a quantity of material typically generated by the removal of small amounts of brush and/or trees from a residential property. The program is <u>not</u> intended to facilitate lot clearing or the generation of large quantities of brush and/or trees, even if done by the resident. Prior to placement of any significant amount of debris or tree material at the roadside, the resident must call (585) 889-2630, Prompt #2 to seek a determination on if the Town will pick-up the debris.

<u>Town Pick-up Schedule:</u> In general, the Town picks up brush and tree limbs on the schedule below. However, during times of increased service demand such as spring pickup season or after a severe storm, there will be delays which will impact the pickup schedule. For the latest information on the status of the pickup schedule, please contact the dispatch line at (585) 889-2630, prompt #2.

Effective January 4, 2021, the Town will be modifying the schedule for the brush and tree limb program in order to provide residents with a more consistent pickup rotation. As such, the current two (2) route system of alternating weeks will be modified into a four (4) route system, with each route being picked up the same week each month starting with the first Monday of the month. Brush and tree limbs must be cut and stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the road. Please stack brush, logs, and shrubs separately. Limbs should be left as long as possible. Logs must be cut as short as possible. All material, except log pieces, will be chipped. Material not chipped will be collected by another vehicle, possibly the next day. Chips are available for reuse at the Highway garage storage area and by delivery to the home upon request. Leaf mulch is also available for reuse.

**Green waste**, vines, weeds, sticks, and shrubs shall be piled separately for packer pick-up. <u>PLEASE DO NOT BAG</u>. WE WILL NOT PICK UP BAGS AND WE DO NOT PICK UP GRASS CLIPPINGS. Backyard composting is suggested.

**Metal items** and white goods, EXCLUDING dehumidifiers, air conditioners, refrigerators, and freezers (unless Freon has been removed & Red Tagged). Please call your private hauler for details regarding those items.

**Rocks, concrete, brick, and dirt.** Must be piled separately and not in pieces larger than 12". <u>PLEASE DO NOT BAG.</u>

All inquiries should be directed to the Department of Public Works Office at 889-2630, Monday – Friday between 7:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. NOTE: May through September, hours are Monday – Thursday 6:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Friday 6:00 a.m. – 10:00 a.m.

- No Tires must be off rims to be collected by your private hauler
- Do not place items in concrete gutters, ditches, or on top of storm drains
- Pile materials separately from items to be collected by your private hauler
- No contractor-generated tree waste or debris
- No construction debris or building materials
- No furniture, TVs, fuel tanks
- Residents having items which are considered hazardous waste material should call Monroe County Hazardous Waste at 753-7600 for information on disposal.



## **Parks**



### **BALLANTYNE PARK**

This is a two acre park located on Ballantyne Road, next to the Arc of Monroe County. Park amenities include a playing field and playground.

### **DAVIS PARK**

Davis Park is a 52-acre park that can be accessed from either Chestnut Ridge Road or Paul Road. Davis Park is home to six baseball fields, five soccer fields, two open air pavilions which are available for rent, restrooms, tennis courts, and two playground areas.

#### **MEMORIAL PARK**

Located at 3235 Chili Avenue, this 11.6 acre park is home to many playing fields, a basketball court, and a playground. Memorial Park playing fields include six baseball fields, two of which have lights. Merante Field, which is a premier soccer/football field with lights, is also located at Memorial Park.

### **HUBBARD PARK**

This seven acre park is located in North Chili on Union Street near Parkway Drive. Hubbard Park consists of a baseball field, tennis courts, a basketball court, and a playground.

### **CHILI NATURE TRAIL**

The Nature Trail is located off Chili Avenue, behind the Chili Heights Apartment complex. This 36-acre park is made up of various trails, an open field, scenic pond and two overlook areas.

### WIDENER PARK

This 28-acre recreational area is located at 400 Chili-Scottsville Road. The property is home to an 18 hole discgolf course, a picnic pavilion available for rent, beautiful landscapes and a trail perfect for exploring the park.

### **UNION STATION PARK**

Access to the park and lodge is off Union Street in North Chili at the end of Rock Island Road. Recreation facilities surrounding a lodge, playground equipment, a new sprayground, a nature trail, access to Black Creek, 2 athletic fields, a basketball court and a paved trail perfect for walking and biking.

### **YOLANDA PARK**

Yolanda Park, a 3.7 acre park, is located on Yolanda Drive and consists of a soccer field and playground equipment.

Often mealtime becomes a real challenge for individuals who are recuperating from an illness or who are too ill or frail to prepare a meal. Meals on Wheels is a service that provides the valuable nutrition needed. To be eligible for this service a person must be:

- 60 years of age;
- Homebound;
- Living alone or with someone who is unable to prepare nutritious meals and/or is absent during the day.

Visiting Nurse Service has numerous meal programs. The meals, which are funded by the Office for the Aging, have a suggested donation of \$3.50 per meal.

### **FOOD CUPBOARDS**

There are many sources of food in the Chili area for your needs. If you are running a bit low and need some assistance, please feel free to contact one. 
