**RESOLUTION - DIRECTING COLLECTION OF TAXES WITH FEES AND PENALTIES THEREON IN ACCORDANCE WITH NOTICE PREVIOUSLY POSTED.**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF C. Lili, as follows:

Section 1. That in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 272 of the Laws of 1943, the (Collector,  
Madeline DentonReceiver of Taxes, Town Clerk) is hereby directed to continue to receive taxes in the year 1943 at the rate specified <sup>(his</sup> in (her notice as given for the collection of taxes in the year 1943, pursuant to the law then in effect.

Sec. 2. That this resolution shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, a directive was issued to this Town Board by a representative of the New York State War Emergency Board in the year 1942, providing that each Town in the County of Monroe establish and maintain an operations headquarters within the Town for the purpose of maintaining an office on a twenty-four hour basis to receive any and all instructions, directives, etc., as to air raids, blackouts, and any other instructions or orders during the period of the war emergency, and

WHEREAS, in compliance with said directive, this Town Board rented an office in the home of Warren Henderson, in Chili Center, Town of Chili, County of Monroe, and State of New York, and

WHEREAS, under the date of the 3 day of March, 1943, the said Warren Henderson informed this Town Board that it must vacate the office so rented by it from the said Warren Henderson as soon as practicable, and

WHEREAS, the said Town of Chili is the owner of a plot of land located in Chili Center in said Town of Chili, County of Monroe, and State of New York, and

WHEREAS, said Town of Chili has in its treasury an unexpended surplus from the year 1942, out of which no committments have been made.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that

FIRST: A temporary building be constructed on the land owned by the Town of Chili at Chili Center in the said Town of Chili, County of Monroe, and State of New York, for the purpose of maintaining an operations headquarters as required by the directive above referred to and for any other purposes in transacting the Town business.

239-2 SECOND: That said building be paid for out of the

surplus moneys held in the treasury in the Town of Chili from the operations of the Town business in 1942.

THIRD: That the cost of said building to be constructed shall not exceed the sum of \$ .

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF  
CHILI

Whereas it has been brought to the attention of this Town Board that there has been created a traffic hazard upon the Scottsville Road in the Town of Chili in and about the Municipal Airport of the City of Rochester, and in front of the Brushing-Vinans Corporation plant located on or near the said Municipal Airport, and

Whereas the said traffic hazard has been created due to the employees, visitors, and officials of said plant parking their automobiles in front of said plant on the right of way of the said Scottsville Road and on or near the improved part of said road, and

Whereas the Town Superintendent of Highways has informed this Town Board that it is impossible to adequately maintain, plow and sweep said road free of snow and ice in the winter time due to the parking as aforesaid.

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved that the Supervisor and/or the Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Chili be and hereby is authorized and empowered on behalf of this board to consult proper officials of Monroe County and/or the State of New York for the purpose of organizing with them a no parking zone in said area for the purpose of removing the traffic hazard now existing and making it possible for the Town Superintendent of Highways to properly plow, sweep and clear said highway of snow and ice in the winter season.

WHEREAS, previous to January 1, 1943 the town superintendent of highways received his pay on a per diem basis; and

WHEREAS, during such period the said town superintendent of highways was also employed by the County of Monroe for certain parts of the year, for which he was also paid on a per diem basis; and

**RESOLVED BY THIS TOWN BOARD as follows:**

Section 1. That the consent of this town board is hereby given to the employment of the town superintendent of highways by the County of Monroe or by any village within the town, provided however, that the said town superintendent of highways shall at all times be available to perform any and all duties required of him to be performed in connection with the care and maintenance of the town highways and bridges.

Sec. 2. That the resolution heretofore adopted fixing the salary of the town superintendent of highways, be and the same is hereby amended by reducing the said salary proportionate to the amount received by the said town superintendent of highways from the County of Monroe or from any village within this town for services performed for said county or village as foreman, deputy foreman or assistant foreman.

Sec. 3. That whenever the town superintendent of highways is so employed as a foreman, deputy foreman or assistant foreman for any other municipality, he shall certify to the supervisor of this town at the end of each month during which he is so employed, the amount received by him as salary from such municipality and thereupon the amount of the next salary payment received by him from this town shall be reduced by a like amount, provided however, that in no event shall the total salary of the town superintendent of highways of this town, from whatever source derived, be less than the amount heretofore fixed in the budget and by resolution of this town board as the salary of town superintendent of highways for the year.

Sec. 4. That this resolution shall take effect June 1, 1943.
