RAYMOND B. STUART, being duly sworn, says: I reside in the Town of Chili, Monroe County, New York, and I am the Town Clerk of said Town of Chili. I am familiar with the authorization by the Town Board of said Town at its meeting January 10, 1945 to purchase one Brockway Model 260XW dump truck, four yard body, auxiliary transmission, air brakes, for \$8,495.00 and to deliver as the balance of the payment therefor four certificates of indebtedness for \$1,987.50 each, payable respectively March 15, 1946, March 15, 1947, March 15, 1948 and March 15, 1949, and I am familiar also with the previous authorizations of the Town Board for which any obligation is still unpaid. The above-mentioned certificates of indebtedness, plus all other unpaid obligations of the Town of Chili for the purchase or repair of stone crushers, power rollers, motor trucks, scarifiers, concrete mixers, traction engines or road machines for grading and scraping, equipment, tools and other implements, do not result in a total of more than \$25,000.00 of required payments for such purposes in any one of the years 1946, 1947, 1948 and 1949.

I am making this affidavit with the knowledge that Central Trust Company Rochester N. Y. is relying upon it in receiving said certificates of indebtedness by endorsement from Brockway Motor Company, Inc.

Dear Dr. Vail:

This is to confirm our conference with Mr. Moore, District Sanitary Engineer, on February 21st at the Ballantine School, Chili Town, in regard to its possible use for housing of refugees from the surrounding properties if and when high water occurs in the Genesee River Valley.

I understand from reports from Mr. Moore that this school building was used in 1940 by the inhabitants in the area and that it did require considerable supervision by both the police and health authorities and such supervision could only be given at a considerable expense since the building was isolated and could only be approached by boat or by truck driven through the water flowing over all highways in the immediate vicinity. The town officials experienced considerable difficulty with breakdown in trucking equipment due to inability to secure lubrication of vital driving parts when high water washed lubricant out of the moving parts.

I further understand that bacteriological analysis collected at the drilled well used as a source of water supply at the school indicated the water to have been free of contaminating organisms throughout the entire time of the high water. However, dependence upon bacteriological reports of the well at the time of emergency is not entirely satisfactory since the report on the analysis is not available until at least 48 to 72 hours after the water sample has been submitted for examination. Consequently, there is always likelihood of the well becoming contaminated and being used as a source of water supply for several days before the report of analysis discloses that the use of water should be discontinued.

The sewage disposal of this school was approved by the State Department of Health in accordance with recommendations made by the District Engineer and provides for the removal of sedible solids with discharge of the effluent from the septic tank to the Genesee River with provision for chlorination of the effluent if and when it was found to be desirable. The septic tank when installed had to be located as high above the river as possible but even so it is likely that at the time of the 1940 flood surcharging of this tank occurred.

At this time no one can predict how high the river will go if spring floods occur but the 1940 experience would indicate that only a foot or two rise about the 1940 level would result in flooding of the school building itself, consequently, any inhabitants of the area who took refuge in the school building would have to be moved out and in the meantime along with the high water there is always a possibility of the well becoming contaminated and sewage disposal not being satisfactory.

It is our understanding that the Monroe County authorities for civilian protection together with the sheriff and Red Cross have made plans for evacuating inhabitants of the flooded areas to a predetermined point within the City of Rochester. In the plans they have formulated, it is proposed that all refugees will be at one center and they want as far as possible to avoid self-created centers such as at the Ballantine School where

control of feeding and housing of the individuals can only be done under difficult conditions. Because of the potential health hazards mentioned above, this office agrees with the plans prepared by the county officials and, therefore, recommends that the Board of Health of Chili take action along with the School Board in declaring the Ballantine School unsatisfactory as a refugee center in case of floods. A report of this action should be given to the Monroe County Civilian Defense Council as well as the County Sheriff who will then be in a position to enforce the action of the local officials.
