

CHILI TOWN BOARD
June 15, 2022

A regular meeting of the Chili Town Board was held on June 15, 2022 at the Chili Town Hall, 3333 Chili Avenue, Rochester, New York 14624 at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Supervisor David Dunning.

PRESENT: Councilman DeCory; Councilman Slattery, Councilwoman Sperr, Councilman Valerio and Supervisor David Dunning.

ALSO PRESENT: Dawn Forte, Supervisor's Secretary; Sandra Hewlett, Stenographer; Jared Hirt, Counsel for the Town; Virginia Ignatowski, Town Clerk; Daniel Knapp, Director of Finance; David Lindsay, Commissioner of Public Works/Highway Superintendent; Councilman Slattery, Deputy Town Supervisor; Scott Bonnewell, Insurance Counselor.

The invocation was given by Virginia Ignatowski.

The Pledge of Allegiance was cited. The fire safety exits were identified for those present.

At this point, a Public Forum was conducted to allow public speakers to address the Town Board. No speakers addressed the Town Board. The Public Forum concluded at 7:02 p.m.

MATTERS OF THE SUPERVISOR:

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: The only thing that I wanted to just mention is the Chil-E Fest, of course, is coming up, starting Friday night with the parade at 6:30. We'll be leaving from St. Pius Church and going up Chili Avenue.

The State has been gracious enough to say that they wouldn't mill before our parade so that we'll have a better road. I kind of disagree with the fact that the milled road wouldn't be better than the current road, but nonetheless, they're looking out for the safety of our residents and they will hold off on milling it until after our parade.

COUNCILWOMAN SPERR: I was going to ask. Good. Good.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: For our residents, anybody that does see this before the Chil-E Fest, keep in mind there is still construction being done, curb work being done, gutter work being done. Please, when you're out watching the parade, be very careful where you're walking for your safety. We don't want to see anybody get hurt.

I would also like to say as it relates to the Chil-E Fest, I have seen a lot of chatter on social media with regards to the parking.

And what most people should understand at this point, if they don't already, the parking is actually quite convenient to the Community Center. You don't have to walk down Archer Road, up Beaver Road Extension and then back down Old Chili Scottsville Road like some people are mentioning.

There is a road already back there very close to the parking. And we will have some shuttles that will shuttle some people around. And there will be handicapped parking on-site so parking shouldn't be the issue that some people have made it out to be. It should be fairly convenient.

I think David (Lindsay) and his guys are doing a great job with the parking plan and putting things together.

So hopefully the weather will hold out. Right now the long-range forecast looks pretty good. We're not going to have 85 degrees for the parade this year. I think there will be a lot of people that will be happy about that. But I believe it will be in upper 70s so we should have a very pleasant day for that.

Other than that, I don't believe I have anything else.

Councilman Slattery, looks like you have something on your mind. Please share.
