CHILI TOWN BOARD November 16, 2022

A regular meeting of the Chili Town Board was held on November 16, 2022 at the Chili Town Hall, 3333 Chili Avenue, Rochester, New York 14624 at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Supervisor David Dunning.

PRESENT:

Councilman DeCory, Councilman Slattery, Councilwoman Sperr, Councilman Valerio and

Supervisor David Dunning.

ALSO PRESENT: Dawn Forte, Supervisor's Secretary; Sandra Hewlett, Stenographer; Virginia Ignatowski, Town Clerk; David Lindsay, Commissioner of Public Works/Highway Superintendent; Councilman Slattery, Deputy Town Supervisor; Daniel Knapp, Director of Finance; Jared Hirt, Counsel for the Town; Scott Bonnewell, Insurance Counselor.

The invocation was given by Virginia Ignatowski.

The Pledge of Allegiance was cited. The fire safety exits were identified for those present.

PRESENTATIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Ed Martin, DDS – Incentive Zoning for 269 Ballantyne Road. 1.

MR. MARTIN: Thank you very much. Hello and good evening. As Supervisor Dunning said, my name is Ed Martin. I'm a licensed engineer with DDS. I'm here tonight representing Turner Underground and their proposal for incentive rezoning of the subject property which is 35 acres in area. I'm sure you're familiar with it. Just west of the railroad tracks and south side of Ballantyne Road.

I'm not sure if the Board is familiar, but Turner recently did a new site plan and they have a new site operation down on Scottsville Road. It has been operating very successfully and they're in need of some more storage space that won't interfere with neighboring properties. So we identified this as a potential site mainly because it is unencumbered by flood plain and something more recently that Mr. Wanzenried brought up to me, and that is the Town's prime soils, which to do encumber a large portion of this area. And what we're proposing is a storage yard located in the northeast quadrant of this property and it is specifically located there to avoid the prime soils as mapped by the Town. So we think it's a win/win situation with the incentive zoning. I understand the process is one that if this Board deems it necessary or appropriate to refer us to the Planning Board for their recommendation, we would then come back here to -- for a Public Hearing.

So we're here tonight just simply asking that you consider referring us to your Board to get some Planning feedback on this proposal.

With that, I would be happy to answer any questions.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: So in regards to the parcel then, you have the Greenway that is directly behind it and then the property goes over the other side of the Greenway?

MR. MARTIN: Yes, it does. Correct.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: So are they looking to do anything on the -- I would call it the southern side of the Greenway?

MR. MARTIN: Not at all. In fact, from what Mr. Wanzenried told me, that if we deviate from what we're showing right now, do anything different, we need to come back and visit this Board. So the incentive zoning proposal is stronger than most.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: From what regards?

MR. MARTIN: So if we were to deviate from this plan, we have to come back from it. Versus if you were to do a straight rezoning, we could basically do whatever the code allows. This is very site

So to answer your question, we propose nothing south of that Greenway. In fact, we propose nothing outside of what we're showing on the plan here.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: I know you don't have a lot of neighbors, but have you been in contact with any -

MR. MARTIN: I personally have not, but Rhett Turner has and I understand the gentleman to the west is in support of this. I have encouraged him to get some kind of a written letter back from him. I don't want to pretend to speak for him, but before we come back here for a Public Hearing, we would certainly have some kind of feedback from them and any other neighbors we can contact.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: I don't want to get into playing Planning Board or anything like that, but just the thought process for this parcel, what you're looking to do, maybe a little more detail?

MR. MARTIN: So it's literally a storage yard. It looks like a gravel parking lot. Whether or not it is fenced in is to be determined. Ideally, Rhett would like it bermed off so that you can't really see it from Ballantyne Road and there would be a gate closer to Ballantyne Road to minimize the likelihood of somebody trespassing.

I'm suggesting that they include in the proposal some tractor-trailer units just for some more secure storage. They might be storing pipe and things like that that might be easily stolen.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: So when you look at it from the perspective that they also have the other property down on Scottsville Road -- so is this to relieve some of the congestion on that property?

MR. MARTIN: It is. And I think it's also to facilitate being a good neighbor to the residents to the west. So by having some of the equipment over here, it's -- there is less commotion going on and just less activity. That's -- that's pretty much it.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: I know there is a noise issue with them starting the equipment earlier in the morning and the residents there can hear it. The diesels, letting them get warmed up.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Can I address that? Do you mind?

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: Yes.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: First, Rhett Turner has been -- and Jane over in the office have been great to work with.

And yes, you're absolutely right. The noise issue, to the best of my knowledge, was resolved by actually moving the vehicles to the north side of the property for the most part and they're not starting them up at 4 o'clock in the morning and letting them sit there and idle. And if they do, they are on the west side of the property which is away from the facility. So they have been wonderful to work with to try to resolve that issue.

While this is not a part of the incentive zoning, I think it is important for this Board to know that Rhett Turner also did a significant amount of work for the visual impacts of the facility from that one unit that sits at the very end of Genesee View Trail there. They bermed it, put in some landscaping and some trees. We have gotten a letter back from the Homeowners' Association, Genesee Riverview, that they accepted this as a great resolution to the visual impacts that they were seeing from that one residence and they also — that's the Genesee — the Homeowners' Association also agreed to maintain that area in perpetuity and it would no longer be the responsibility of Rhett Turner to take care of the site.

These are certainly things outside of the incentive, but they did this at our request, or the Town's request –

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: To be a good neighbor.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: -- to be a good neighbor. And I just think it is important that you know they stepped up to the plate before coming to this Board even for an incentive zoning application to try and mitigate any issues that the neighbors had.

To the best of my knowledge, the notifications I have gotten back from the Homeowner Association, they have done that and accomplished what they set out to do.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: Which Supervisor, I know that, as well. And I know -- I want to give credit to Rhett, but I also want to give credit to his father who passed, Bob Turner. He made that commitment when he was going through the process to be a good neighbor, to work with the Townhomes, Riverview there, as well. So -- so unfortunately with Bob (Turner) passing, you know, Rhett now is taking this over. But I know that you went out there and met with the residents in Riverview, talked to them, stood on their back porch or patio and looked at that, as well. So I know the improvements that they made over on that parcel which was key to this -- to our Board and to the Town, to the residents.

Now, will they be moving any of that type -- will they be storing something there or they will be moving trucks over to this location, as well?

MR. MARTIN: I think the answer to that is yes to both. There will be equipment stored there that is not used regularly that might be mobilized infrequently but taken to a jobsite and potentially even pipe storage type of thing, pallet storage, equipment that is used on the site, drill bits, piping, that sort of thing.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: Because I know also -- just my one concern, being on the Greenway, I know there's a -- you know, another business down the road -- along the railroad tracks that was -- there was some vandalism and some theft. So that would be my concern, just being on the backside of that Greenway, people having access to it.

And also, I know -- actually, I rode my bicycle on that Greenway today as a matter of fact. And you have some hunters that are in those woods that are right there. So that is just one thing to be concerned with.

MR. MARTIN: Sure. I appreciate that feedback. He is considering fencing. He has talked about cameras, of course.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: Right.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: I guess that means I can't go hunting back there now?

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: I don't -

CHILI TOWN BOARD MEETING - November 16, 2022

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: That takes that out. One more spot I can't go to.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: Hunting, fishing, loving every day.

COUNCILWOMAN SPERR: No. But I like your concept of moving the trailers there to store things

so it is more secure and I think a fence might be a good idea, too.

COUNCILMAN DECORY: Absolutely.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Any other questions from the Board?

Then I would ask at this point is there any objections sending this application to the Planning Board for further consideration?

There were no objections.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: The next move is to get to the Planning Board.

MR. MARTIN: We're on our way. Thank you for your time. SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Thank you, Ed (Martin). Appreciate it.
