

CHILI TOWN BOARD
January 15, 2025

A regular meeting of the Chili Town Board was held on January 15, 2025 at the Chili Town Hall, 3333 Chili Avenue, Rochester, New York 14624 at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Supervisor David Dunning.

PRESENT: Councilman DeCory; Councilman Slattery, Councilwoman Sperr, Councilman Valerio and Supervisor David Dunning.

The invocation was given by Virginia Ignatowski.

The Pledge of Allegiance was cited. The fire safety exits were identified for those present.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: We do have some presentations this evening and I'm going to ask the Town Board if you would please join me down here for -- I don't see Pat is here tonight. I don't see Charlie here.

But I do see my favorite Historian -- former Historic Preservation Board member, Bonnie Moore.

Bonnie (Moore), could you please join us?

Bonnie (Moore), on behalf of the Town of Chili, we would just like to thank you for your service to the Town. You have not only been on the Historic Preservation Board for -- I think for like forever, as well as you were the Historian -- when I first came in, you were my Historian for a while.

As well as I know you have had a lot of input on some of the -- the Barn Book and the Cobblestone Book that we put together here. You were instrumental in that, as well as some of the activities around our Bicentennial. So thank you for just -- the contributions you've made to make this such a wonderful place to be.

BONNIE MOORE: I appreciate that. Can I thank them?

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: You can thank whomever you would like.

BONNIE MOORE: I wanted you to know that I grew up in a little Town in Pennsylvania, Southwest Pennsylvania, and it had streetlights and it had sidewalks everywhere. It was everything. You could go get ice cream. You could -- well, it just had everything.

So I came up here -- first time I had ever seen Chili and I was coming down Buffalo Road and they had no streetlights. There were no sidewalks. And the more I thought "Who would live in this God forsaken place?"

I'm living and loving in this God forsaken place ever since.

But thank you. You have made my Town, my new Town a good place to live and bring up children. All three of my kids live here and I don't think they will -- well, until the will is read, they won't leave.

I know as long as I have been here and many, many years before I ever got here, Paul (Bloser), you were involved in some way, shape or form with the Town of Chili. You were on the Zoning Board of Appeals and then subsequently on the Planning Board.

And you will excuse me, I don't remember if there was other things that you might have been involved with --

PAUL BLOSER: Drainage.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Drainage Committee.

COUNCILWOMAN: Chil-E Fest.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Always there for our Chil-E Fest.

But again, thank you for your contribution to the Town. I know a lot of things have been done and we have gotten a lot of things accomplished in this Town and a lot of the way that this Town looks right now is because of the efforts you have contributed to the Boards and Committees that you belonged to.

So again, just a brief -- or a certificate of our appreciation and congratulations for your retirement, if you will, from the Town at this point. But thank you for your many, many years of service. We greatly appreciate it.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: And being a Veteran.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Yes. Thank you for your service to the country.

COUNCILWOMAN SPERR: Thanks, Paul (Bloser).

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: Paul (Bloser), do you want to tell us a story about when you moved to Chili and how many traffic lights there were?

PAUL BLOSER: There wasn't any.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Not for nothing, I'm surprised there were even roads when Bonnie (Moore) came. (Laughter.)

PAUL BLOSER: 50 years.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: 50 years?

PAUL BLOSER: Uh-huh.

A photograph was taken. (Applause.)

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: I don't think -- Jessica, are you here? No.

Pat is not here.

Mark Merry is not here.

And Carla Rosati.

We're trying something -- just so you folks know, we're trying something -- the Board brought this up a little while ago. We don't do enough necessarily to recognize the people that have contributed so much to the Town of Chili. So when they do leave and --

I know we also have something for Dick Schickler, who made tremendous contributions to the Conservation Board. We have something very different for him when he is able to come in to visit with us. Or we're going to go visit him. One way or the other.

But he also used to maintain the gardens out on the -- on the expressway. He did that at no cost to the Town of Chili. So he volunteered his time and the efforts there. So we will be recognizing also Mr. Schickler for that.

We want to recognize the people that have contributed their time and efforts to the improvements and the things that we see around the Town of Chili and everything.

So you will see these hopefully from time to time. Hopefully not too often because that means somebody is leaving a Committee and we have to try and replace them and nobody wants to come in to replace them.

TOWN BOARD DISCUSSION RELATED TO THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION:

COUNCILMAN VALERIO: Supervisor, can you just give a little brief synopsis of the changes here?

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Of these codes?

COUNCILMAN VALERIO: Of this code specifically.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: This was for -- this was for sunset on -- on -- sunset for Planning Board approvals, site plan approval and preliminary site plan approval.

COUNCILMAN VALERIO: One year is it?

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: It's -- there's -- I don't remember the specifics of the code. I don't have it in front of me here -- I do. Yeah, it is there.

There -- there is a time frame -- what we found is that we've had things that have had preliminary site plan approval or we have had things that have had final site plan approval that don't put a shovel in the ground for years. And in that time, codes change in which we have -- we can't do anything about it once they have gotten their approvals. They're able to do it to the previous code. Where for the best welfare of the people in the Town of Chili, it seemed better to make -- put a sunset on it so that if they don't do something or don't meet up to a certain point, that we're able to basically say "You got to come back to the Planning Board and" -- "You got to meet current code."

We want -- we want people to be able to meet current code.

COUNCILMAN VALERIO: Thank you.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: That's a brief synopsis of that particular legislation.

COUNCILMAN SLATTERY: Basically other municipalities, James (Valerio), as well, what they do is when they stamp plans, on the stamp it will state that "This plan is only good for two years" and then the applicant will have to come back in if they don't do anything within that time period. They have to come back in for re-approval. Sometimes it's just to restamp it.

Other times if they try to change, modify the plan or if the specs have changed -- so the building specs -- then they will have to go through -- go through that approval process again.

But a lot of municipalities will get these projects that come in and then they will just sit in the filing cabinet and some of them may never go anywhere.

COUNCILMAN VALERIO: The reason I brought that up is because I know that in particular we have had that happen here in Chili a couple times.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: Yeah. Usually -- usually something happens that says "Look, we need to revisit this and do something about it."
